Subject: Walsh Cooper Property


Work done this season failed to locate ore of any consequence but erratic low grade copper mineralization was encountered at several localities.

The magnetic survey shows one anomaly worthy of further exploration and the property's geological setting is not unfavourable.

This property does not justify Mogul making a down payment at this time and the decision is whether we should attempt to make a new deal or drop the option. Since it is a geological bet and finances for prospecting are limited, I would suggest the following:

- (1) Mr. W. Sharp be authorized to attempt to dispose of this property to any interested party. Mogul to receive \$3,000 for its full interest, *covering expenses to date.*
- (2) Failure of (1) above, Walsh and Cooper be told that no further expenditures will be made this season, but Mogul will reconsider the whole deal next spring.

WITH THIS MY REPORT AND MAP FOLLOWING OUR RECENT PROGRAMME AT THE COOPER-WELCH 'WELCO' PROSPECT. I HAVE INCLUDED AN EXTRA SET FOR MR. PERRY.

I SUGGEST THAT YOU STUDY THIS REPORT WITH THE OPTION TERMS, AS AGREED UPON BY YOURSELF AND JIM COOPER, IN MIND. YOU WILL REMEMBER THAT YOU ADVISED ME OF THE SCALE OF PAYMENTS, BUT I HAVE NOTHING IN THE WAY OF A TIME SCHEDULE OF PAYMENTS, OTHER THAN THE GENERAL UNDERSTANDING THAT WE CAN CALL UPON THE OWNERS FOR ADDITIONAL WORK OR SERVICES, FOR WHICH WE PAY, PRIOR TO ACTUALLY ACCEPTING THE PROPERTY AND OPTION SCHEDULE.
