I was finally able to get a meeting with Roger Caven. Liaison with Roger is difficult at best, but recently it has been almost impossible. There has been little communication since the start of the Toe Group survey.

Roger has no sections started, but one indicated anomaly seems to occupy the area of our E - W trend of Skarn, pyrite, cpy. on 26N/48W.

The proposed staking and grid extension on the West of the Toe Group will commence tomorrow. The I.P. will be finished to 48W tomorrow, so it means this extension area cannot be surveyed at this time.

Roger has requested delivery of the Mal-Chal Reports by 3 November. These will be required for filing by Nov. 7th, latest. If these come to your office, or in some manner, would you please see that cpoies of invoices paid are enclosed to substantiate the value of the survey to be claimed.

Much of the area over the Mal-Chal East anomaly is covered with deep overburden. This may be the cause of the lack of Geochemical correspondence. Our deep sampling over the area may not have penetrated enough for results. However, samples M-9-68 to 17-68 were in an area of bedrock outcrops.

Fabian Forgeron's report was encouraging that the sampling and anomalies were sustantiated some. All areas of interest require further detail sampling. There is apparently some good I. P. response in the area of the intrusive found at 38S/40W, also. I did not get much info from Roger, but will try to get more on this for you later.
