Dear Charlie:

This is answer to yours of July 31st. Your idea of drilling the Sunset vein extension on each side of Hole #4 is OK. as long as core recoveries are high. However our past experience at Scranton has been with rather poor core recoveries, so that you end up with an "indication" of what might be there. This means you eventually have to sink or drift to prove them up. That's the reason I have recommended actual drifting or sinking etc when the area to be tested is not too far out, reserving the drill for preliminary exploration work where it would not be wise to start a development program without some "indication" of what's there. However you may get fairly good core recoveries on the short holes contemplated so they could be justified.

Too bad the Pontiac is not running out too well but I wait impatiently without seeing the details plotted. Hope you get funds soon!

Dear Bill.

Received your letter to-day, was going to write you last weekend but just did not get around to it.

I thought you would send in your report as soon as you arrived back at Vancouver. I put in a couple of rounds up & dilled 8' test hole & found nothing so quit & started to get ready to go up to Upper Pontiac & put some things in shape for winter.

It might be all right to do some more work in Sept. when we have some extra money but right now they do not seem to have any. Bills are not being paid.

I started to-day with car for upper Pontiac have been waiting for 10 days for magnets off car. If they send in money to pay acc'ts I may be able to get something done if not will probably have to quit before winter.

Have spent quite a bit of time looking at Upper Pontiac and I believe we would be much further ahead to bulldoze dump to about 55' below present ditch

and stack a new drift on the vein.
The drift looks pretty tough looks like we would
have to drive lagging as the ground is very
loose & quite wide where it is caved and from
what Scott says in his letter caved a long
ways in. How about it.

Right now I wish I had never taken
on this job & wouldn't have had I known
what their finances were going to be.

Have been expecting word from you
on the last work at 5730 drift, so
will write you instead.

Second thoughts on the '5730' work
indicate we may be stopping only a
short distance from where the vein
may straighten out under the open
cuts. I think we should plan to drive
straight ahead on the strike of the
vein - perhaps another 50' would do -
and check again by cross-cutting or
test-holing. This could be done in
conjunction with the work on the S.W.
extension of Upper Pontiac 'as when'
funds are available, if agreeable to all.

I'll wait for final word from you
before writing my report following last

I have written to Portland to see if they would give me the O.K. to push a drill in Sunrich side and drill a couple holes one on each side of hole #4 which shows mineral or maps. If we hit one in either hole we could drill two or three steeper ones & when we got the level pumped out could drift over to that section while sinking on the other one "shock".

We must find some ore soon. Dorik seems like Pontiac side is going to pay out. Drilled into some oxidation Friday which may make ore. Would still do some drifting on it but would push the other side faster.

What do you think of this. The money is still scarce.
