HELLO BILL,

- Looks like our paths didnt quite lead to the same place at the same time, however, I have submitted two gravel samples for tests, one of which may make a sand blasting feed with little other than washing & screening as it is a fine (?) material (Nothing over 1/2 inch or so) and appears to contain considerable quartz grains, the whole composed of largely angular and sub angular material. I am told sand blast feed goes at approx. \$4. per sack of 100 lb. in Pr. Rupert & Kitimat, and of course similarly priced elsewhere.

With this I have sent two samples of the "croesus" Pegmatite. one of which you will note is more impure and more colored. this one fairly represents the pegmatite across about 100 ft but could have been extended some hundreds of feet further with apparently similar results.

The cleaner, whiter, looking sample represents what could be mined from surface without too much difficulty by discarding more "oxidized iron filled" sections which appear to make up about 50% or

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Slightly higher.

We plan to bring a crusher + Rolls unit onto the Croesus property for crushing gravel and quartz.

Financing will be finalized about July 20 to 30 near our Annual meeting date of July 22 to be held in Terrace, 10 AM, LAKEVIEW HOTEL.

Our plan is to crush & wash a gravel product if that still seems advisable. A party in Terrace has become interested in marketing our proposed product(s) which probably is a good idea as he has trucks and is involved in landscaping etc.

Still foremost in our plan is work on the "Gem" (Gold) but we would like to take a good look at two other Gold carrying structures which are within hauling distance of the "Gem". Both are low elevation, appear to be of identical mineral tenor and are as far as I can determine without more assays, worth considering as mill feed for one mill. A preliminary report will be required on these but can be done quickly.

If you feel some test is required on the Quartz samples herewith, please have them done and bill us directly if you like. Proposed use of quartz is for Stucco, Roofing flower garden, chicken grit etc.
