Reports and a copy of your statement received. Sorry to say that I have not studied the report yet but can say that in calculating, or I should say in guesstimating tonnage we are not far apart. I arrived at a guess of 45,000 tons when expanding to a 5 ft. mining width. I would expect to mine it much narrower than that in some sections. Your account will be paid by the Vancouver office as I did not budget for money in November and am running too close to the bottom of the barrel for comfort.

Walter has written a summary covering the past program's work with his observations which is being typed and will forward a copy to you shortly.
