Monthly Work Report, October, 1970 Subject:

Dear Sir :

During the month, supplementary mapping in the previous map-area was done.

The Jackpot mine workings of which entrances are mostly caved were revisited. The country rocks of the mine are serpentine, whitish grey cherty rock and talcose brown iron-oxidized rock. The cherty rock of the vicinity shows poor sulfide mineralization occasionally but may not have an economic interest so far as the surface exhibition is con-The ores noted in the waste dump and muckpiles are mainly cerned. pyrite and arsenopyrite with a minor Pb-Zn( probably silver too ?) minerals. Now the mine area is covered with 3 - 5 inches snow.

The supplementary mapping might be the job unlimited but should be done to a certain limit .

I will follow your direction.
