Dear Sir,-

"Copper Camp" is situated six or seven miles West of Greenwood, B. C. In the early Boundary days quite a lot of high grade copper ore was shipped from this camp, the principal producing claims being the "King Solomon" owned by D. C. Corbin, Spokane, Wn., and the "Copper Mine" owned by John Moran and the J. B. McAuley Estate.

I understand the "King Solomon" is now bonded to the B. C. Copper Co. although my information did not come from either of the parties concerned.

For years past it has been impossible to do anything with Moran at a reasonable figure. Lately, however, he has seen the matter in a different light and at present we have the "Copper Mine" tied up for \$60,000.00, and I am enclosing a copy of the agreement.

Before doing any work we should tie up the surrounding claims, and Mr. C. M. Campbell is getting a line on this work and will keep us posted as to what progress he is making.

The claim adjoining the "Copper Mine" is owned by McKenzie & Mann and it may be difficult to get a reasonable bond on this claim. It should be easy to secure a long term bond on any of the other claims for from \$5000 to \$10,000 each.

The "Copper Mine" has a very good surface showing which I have seen many times, and very little work with a diamond drill will prove whether or not we wish to develop the property. There are plenty of cabins on the property and diamond drill work may be carried on during the winter months, although the location of the holes should be determined before snow falls.

I have asked Mr. C. M. Campbell to get this matter in shape as soon as possible, sending you maps, agreements, etc. for approval.

I certainly think we should try out this camp during the coming year, as it may be we will find a body of ore here of value to us.
