Northwestern B.C. Hot Spot For Gold

Skyline Explorations Ltd. recently reported that the most recent mining along the 11-16A stope on the 11/16 vein averaged .958 oz/t gold over a length of 262 feet and an average stope width of 7.7 feet.

The company reports that the higher grade western portion, which represents "new" ore reserves, is of particular interest and averaged 1.361 oz/t gold over a length of 100 feet and an average stope width of 9 feet. Skyline says that visible gold was seen at the face of the stope where subdrifting is continuing in ore.

Sampling of the new western end of the stope, which is 60 feet above the main 1125 adit level, have assayed as high as 15.87 oz/t gold.

Norman Anderson, former company chairman, is no longer on Skyline's Board.

Final drilling results have recently been reported from **Hector Resources Inc.**'s diamond drilling program conducted on the company's Skyline area property comprised of the Stu 4 & 5 Claims (27 units), and the Spray 1 & 2 and the Sky 4 & 5 Claims, comprising an additional 40 units.

The company reports that fifteen diamond drill holes totalling 2000 feet were completed to test the Golden Spray Zone which encompasses an anomalous area of auriferous quartz/pyrite veining which is known to extend along an area in excess of 1000 feet. Assay results from these holes have returned values up to 0.20 oz. gold per ton and 4.95 oz. silver per ton over widths of 4-5 feet.

The company's consultants - Pamicon Developments Ltd. - are currently compiling the program results with the objective of recommending an extensive exploration program which will include additional diamond drilling for the 1988 exploration season.
