Jim Mortensen identified one definite and one possible zircon in a thin section of rhyolite from hole #41 - 161.8 m from Eskay Creek. We were going to request about 50 pounds of core from near this depth in hole #41, but since you expressed an interest in dating the Eskay Creek rhyolite we will leave it up to you.

Plans are still for me to be in the Sulphurets and Treaty areas with Jack Henderson in the first two weeks of September. The offer holds for you, Jim and Derek to join us for a day or two examining regional structures.
