The widespread are of low grade gold referred to in the [Boulder Minfile](#) may very be on the south side of Boulder Creek. Both the 120 ppb and 95 ppb are located on the south side of the creek. The area also looks somewhat interesting from Google Earth.

I don't know if the regional geology is mapped all that well that a guy could make any hard conclusions from it.

I made you my 40% partner (but it will cost you (\$80.00) to complete the sale for the 8 claims.
