Skyline probably has no money for roads at this time. It is a piss-ant company. Don't make decisions based on it. 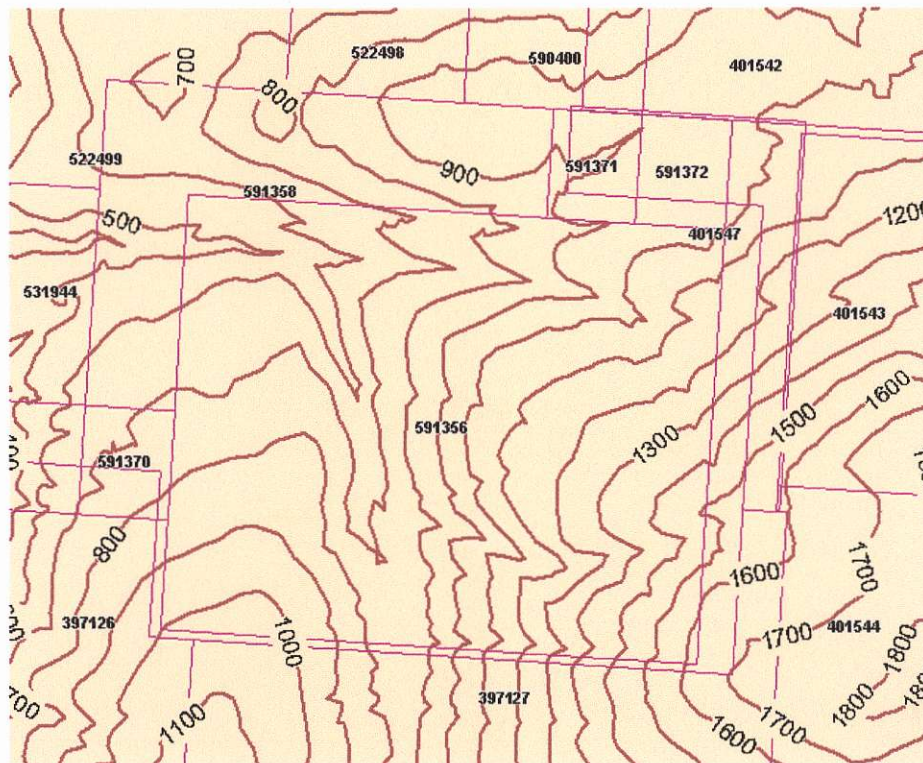

Here are two short assessment reports that may be worth the read.

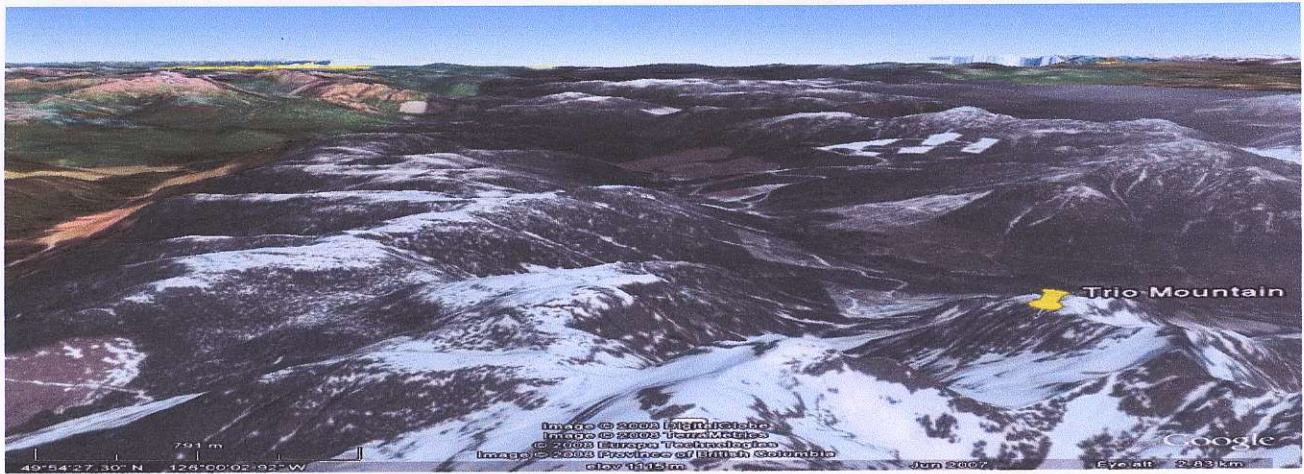

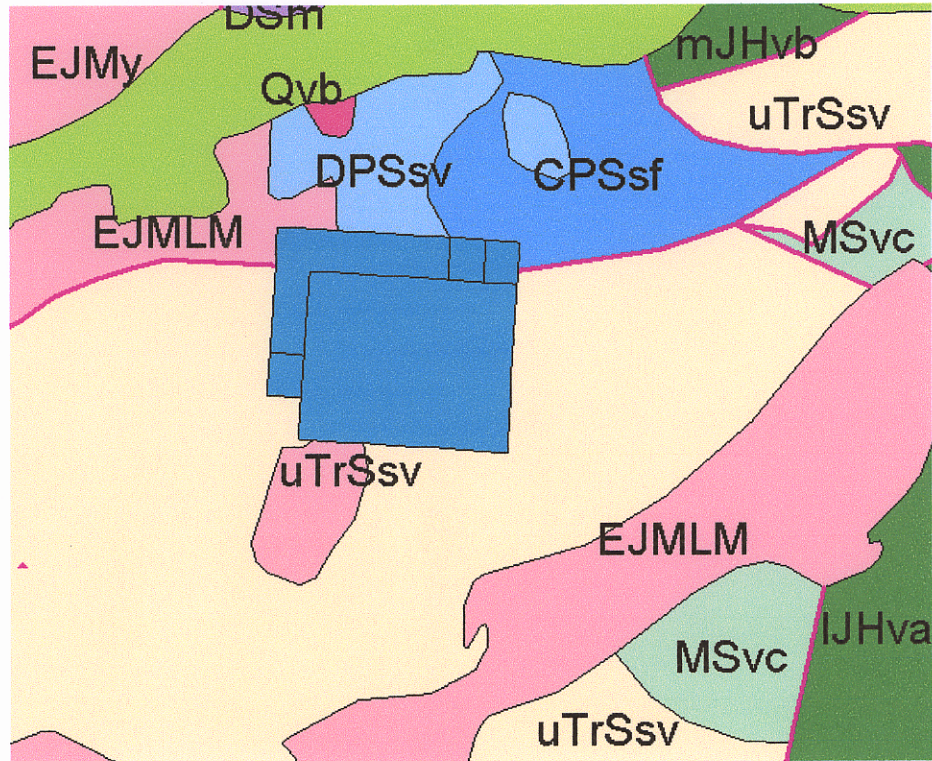
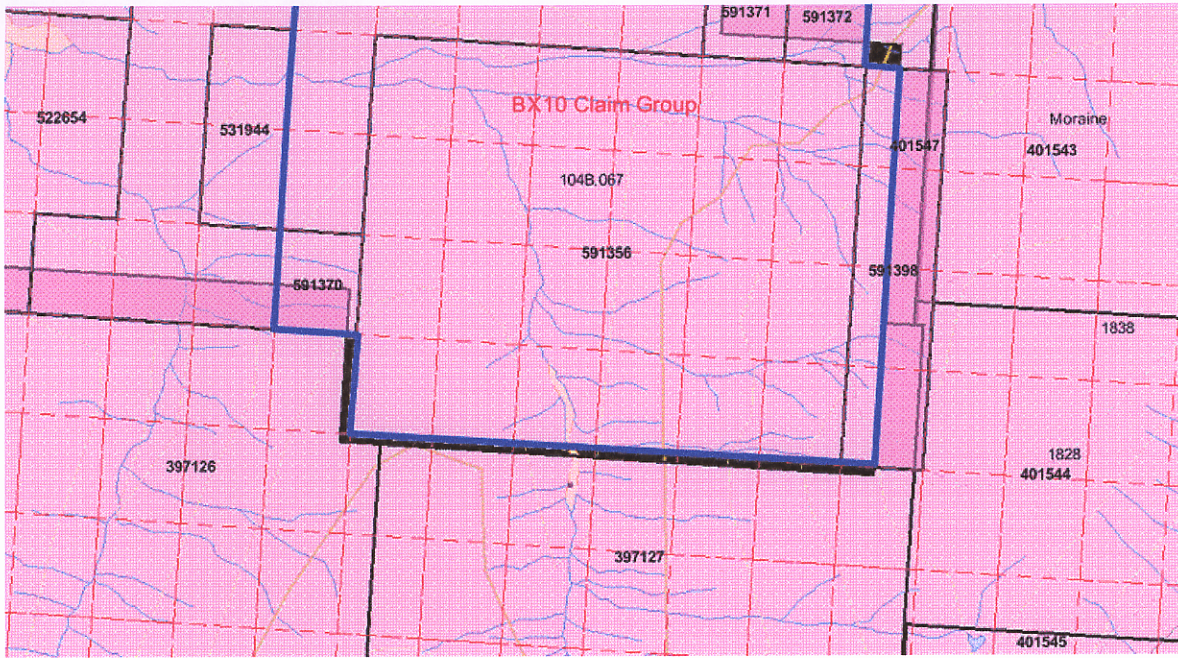
It sounds like a tough day for the markets. Yikes!

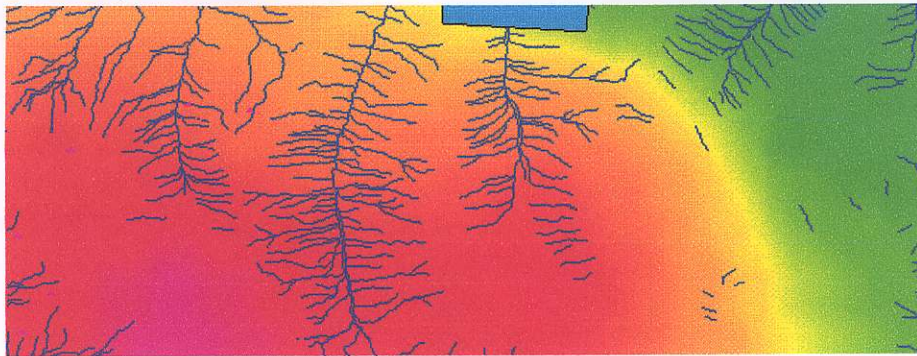
