This note is a brief followup to our discussions on the weekend.

It has come to my attention through talks with Mariette and Rod that the bedrock mapping and related studies proposed by Jack, Mariette and Rod for the Sulphurets-Eskay Creek area this summer are in danger of not being funded.

As you know, I strongly believe that we should ^(the GSC, in particular M.R.D.) give high priority to projects that involve documentation of critical features of significant, possibly world-class, deposits and their geological settings, with a view to establishing useful explanation guidelines and predictive genetic models.

The proposal area is one of major exploration interest and activity, the talent and opportunity are available, the project should link well with ongoing activities of GSC Vancouver, BC Geological Survey Branch, MDRU and the exploration and mining communities, and the proposed products are just what our clients claim to need (bedrock mapping + mineral deposit studies, in an integrated package).

Let's not miss the opportunity to make a major contribution to the exploration and scientific community in a project that will bring much credit to GSC and MRD.
