Dear Mr. Ramsay:

In regard to query about placer gold possibilities on Mitchell and Gingras creeks, I have no expertise in placer mining and have no experience with placer prospects on these creeks. Nevertheless, I understand that Bruce Ballantyne has sent you some data and I enclose a copy of a B.C. Minister of Mines Report published in 1936 that makes reference to placer possibilities on Mitchell and Sulphurets creeks.

I am not sure what Bruce suggested but judging by the size of anomalous gold areas documented in the upper reaches of both Mitchell and Sulphurets creeks, these creeks surely must contain some placer gold. Possibly you would need churn drill samples from near bedrock to properly assess the placer gold possibilities (?). You might note also that Mandy in the 1936 report suggests that some gravel terraces (or benches) might have placer potential.

It is my understanding that you have done considerable research into mineral deposits in the Sulphurets area of British Columbia.

Placer mining has recently been allowed in this area (i.e. Sulphurets & adjoining Creeks) and I have acquired some claims in the area (on Mitchel and Ginross Creeks). I have had limited success in finding any free gold on those creeks and have not been terribly encouraged by my sample assay results. My best results have been .01 Au on Mitchel Creek; however I am not sure of my technique nor what would be considered anomalous in a placer sample. My samples have been pan sample from the creeks.

Have you published any literature or have any personal experience in this area that would be relevant to my pursuits? Would it be at all worthwhile to consider placer platinum in this area. I would be grateful if you
