TARGET F - MURPHY LAKE PROJECT

June 1 - June 15, 1969

GENERAL

The men and equipment from the Target H project were transferred to the Target F area on June 6, 1969. A cabin has been rented at Susan Lake on the southern end of the claim block. This unit, owned by Bond Brothers, will serve as a base camp for the operation.

ACCESS

There is an eight mile gravel road into Susan Lake from the Eagle Creek General Store. Permission is required to use this road, which crossess privately owned land.

CLAIMS SURVEY

A block of ground within the F group came open on June 1st, and was restaked by Carl Langlois for Cyprus. These claims, the J.A.C. 1 through 37, and the J.A.C. Fractions 1 through 11, have since been surveyed and tied into the F claim block. Three open fractions were found in the J.A.C. group. These will be staked at a later date.

GEOLOGICAL MAPPING

Mapping and prospecting have commenced in the southern part of the F claims area. Rock types found to date are mostly basic intrusives, which contain a high accessory iron contact. The location lines from the F claims are being extended into the areas recommended for follow-up work by Ross Kidd. The extended lines will provide control for mapping purposes.

PROSPECTS

A brief inspection was made of a copper prospect located alongside a logging road at Boomerang Lake (see accompanying sketch plan). This showing is located about 5000 feet southeast of the F claims boundary. The showing consists of pyrite and minor chalcopyrite disseminated in a diorite. The outcrop containing the showing covers an area approximately 20 feet by 30 feet. Apparently this ground was staked in 1967 by Coranex and allowed to lapse.

PROGRAM

Geological mapping and prospecting will be continued with special emphasis put on these areas suggested by Mr. Kidd. The original plan to establish a fly camp in the western part of the claim block has been postponed. Charter services in the area will not land fixed wing aircraft on the local lakes. Therefore, once the mapping in the southern section has been completed, a helicopter will be chartered from either 100 Mile House or Williams Lake to set up a fly camp in the northern part of the F claims area.

FOREST CLOSURE

The continuing hot dry weather conditions are creating a serious fire hazard. Unless these conditions change, a forest closure can be expected shortly.
