PROPERTY: KLI MAP LOCATION NO. 6

COMMODITY: COPPER

LOCATION: 56° 27' North 126° 05' West - Omineca Mining District, B.C.
The claims are at the head of the north fork of Kliyul Creek,
about 12 miles west of Aiken Lake.

ACCESS: The access road extends 80 miles northwest from Germansen
Landing to Aiken Lake. Access from Aiken Lake is by
helicopter.

TOPOGRAPHY: The claims lie along the southwest slope of the Mesilinka Ranges
at an elevation of 4500 to 5000 feet, just above timberline.

PROPERTY: 4 claims, KLI 32 - 35, in good standing until 1976.

HISTORY: The claims were staked for El Paso Mining and Milling Company in
1971 to cover a copper stream silt anomaly.

GEOLOGY: The area is underlain by andesitic flows of the Takla Group of
Upper Triassic and Jurassic age. These flows are intruded by
quartz monzonite which outcrops along the northeast side of Kliyul
Creek.

Silicified zones with pyrite occur along fractures in the andesite
near the intrusive contact and to some extent in the instrusive.
The intrusive is well altered and limonitic in the vicinity of
KLI 32 - 35.

GEOCHEMISTRY: The north fork of Kliyul Creek shows anomalous silts over at least
one mile with a build-up from 178 ppm to 320 ppm copper. The
anomalous silts occur in the area of the altered intrusive.

RECOMMENDATIONS: Prospecting, geological mapping and soil sampling are recommended
for the property.
