2 The property owned by the above company, and which is now
3 available for a development deal on a very favorable basis according
4 to Hoover, is evidently the one called "Armstrong's Proserpine Group"
5 on p. 12 of Roy Moore's memorandum of Jan. 27, 1933 to Mr. Mudd.

6 Since that date a syndicate cleaned out the tunnels, the
7 above company was formed, trenching progressed and some of the tunnels
8 were extended a little. Under the direction of C. M. Campbell (for-
9 merly with Granby and American Metal) surveys were made, including the
10 geology of the formations as worked out to date. A good plan on a
11 scale of 300 ft. to the inch, is available. A good camp is established
12 on the Independence claim.

13 Apparently Newmont, as well as Cariboo Gold Quartz, has had some
14 success at finding payable blind veins. I understand they are now
15 milling at a 50-ton rate on their Island Mountain property and have
16 found \$15 ore in the Forest vein of their adjoining property to the
17 northwest of that of Proserpine Gold Mines, Ltd.

18 In addition to the J. D. Galloway report referred to by Mr.
19 Moore other reports by R. R. Wilson and C. M. Campbell are available.

20 Campbell recommends an expenditure on further driving of the
21 tunnels to adequately test this area on the basis of confirmation by
22 Newmont of Cariboo Gold Quartz experience of finding blind veins of
23 commercial importance.

1 R. R. Wilson claims that the surface trenching and pros-
2 pecting tunnels driven by the Mining Corporation roughly parallel the
3 "B" type of veins, and were of little value in prospecting the area
4 in that connection.

5 Hoover offers to lend a report by an English firm of engineers
6 on Cariboo Gold Quartz.
