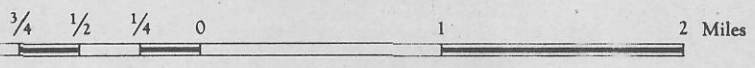

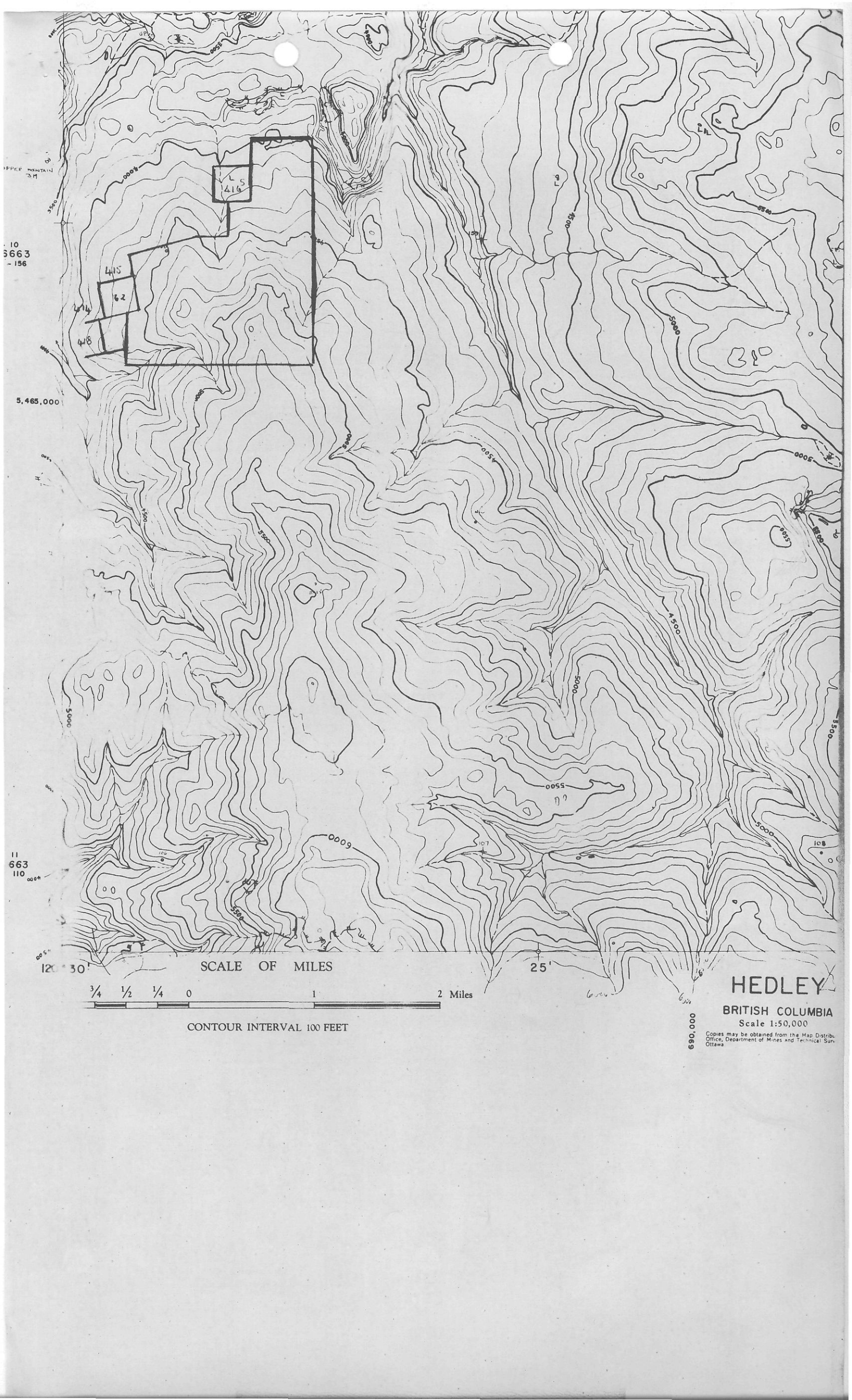

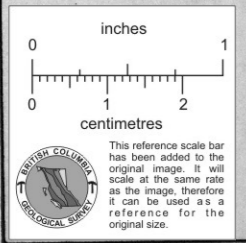

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be mapped with particular attention to the anomalous area. Where necessary and feasible, he says the favourable areas should be tested by bulldozer trenching and/or diamond drilling. He advises a program to cost an estimated \$45,195 in the first stage.

The Twin Mountain workings are about  $2\frac{1}{2}$  miles north east of the Homestake mine which between 1927 and 1941 shipped or treated 7,675 tons of ore with metal recoveries of: gold - 362 ounces; silver - 281,350 ozs; copper - 20,146 lbs; lead - 311,504 lbs; zinc - 448,222 lbs. The Sinmax prospectus says the sulphides at Homestake were recovered from barite veins striking northwesterly and dipping northeasterly as at the Sinmax property.

First reported work on the Twin Mountain property, in 1936, located dolomite and quartz lenses found to contain varying amounts of galena, sphalerite, pyrite and chalcopyrite. At different times in the ensuing years a road was built from Adams Lake at Skwaam Bay to the workings, providing road access to a main highway; an exploratory crosscut adit at 5,000 feet elevation was driven 307 feet; another adit was driven 115 feet lower in elevation for 425 feet; a vein 6 feet wide was reported at 300 feet and a drift run 35 feet to the west. The area of the main workings was restaked, in June 1966, by Clint Keller, who in February, 1968, optioned them to Sinmax, the consideration being 100,000 shares and \$11,000 of which \$5,000 has been paid with the balance payable in 3 instalments of \$2,000 each at 6 month intervals. This purchase followed a 1967 program of line cutting, followed by reconnaissance and limited detailed geochemical and magnetometer surveys which the company was advised discovered significant geochemical anomalies in addition to the known mineral occurrences. Values were found in silver, lead and zinc, but below commercial grade, the report states.

In a report dated July 26, 1968, Mr. Read recommends continuance of the program and extension of grid coverage to a larger area. The geology of the grid area should
