PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

The property comprises some 76 claims situated immediately south of the old Mother Lode and Greyhound mines just west of the old Greenwood Smelter. Granitic plugs of the Nelson Intrusion Series of Mesozoic age cut metamorphic Paleozoic rocks in which high-grade copperrich skarns provided the basis for the old Greenwood Camp mining operations. The present interest lies in the presence of disseminated chalcopyrite and bornite within a small, previously unmapped intrusive plug and adjacent silicified and hornfelsed metasediments and metavolcanics. The property is readily accessible to the Canadian Pacific Railroad and the #3 Trans Provincial Highway.

A covered area of low ground appears to be the junction of two strong linear features. To the north of this, mineralized skarns provide the setting for the old Mother Lode and the as yet unproductive Greyhound Pit. On the east, trenching has exposed an altered medium-grained quartz diorite locally containing up to 0.2% copper, while to the west old workings in horn-felsed andesitic rocks and tactites contain appreciable amounts of chalcopyrite and bornite exposed over a broad zone. A bulk sample taken over an area of 100'x400' assayed 0.02 oz. Au and 0.45% Cu in this locality.

Data from previous I.P., soil geochemical surveys and geological mapping carried out for Utah Construction and Mining as well as an earlier Huntec I.P. survey and diamond drill records are available to Cyprus and indicate that the tactite exposed at the western margin of the intrusive, which is coincident with a ridge of high chargability and high copper values in soils, is a good target area.

The zone extends north-northwest for some 3,000 feet tapering from 1,000 feet at the southern end to 600 feet in the north. Of the five diamond drill holes in the vicinity of this zone, three have cut good copper values in the tactite of up to 200 feet of 0.3% copper with additional values in sludge returns in zones of poor recovery. In the two holes bottoming in tactite, the last three 10 foot assays for DDH #2 ran 0.55%, 0.61% and 0.42% Cu respectively. Hole #3 was abandoned at 150 feet with a bit left in the hole, but showed good values for the length of the hole with from 0.3 to 0.4% Cu. The westerly limits of the tactite have yet to be tested by drilling, but the zone could be up to 600 feet wide as indicated by surface showings. The presence of plums of a few hundred tons of bornite and chalcopyrite can be anticipated from the numerous shallow open pits and short shafts excavated by high graders in the early 1900s.

Some potential also exists on the northern section of the property for homatite-copper replacement orebodies of the Mother Lode and Phoenix type which contained some 5 to 10 m.s.t. of 2% Cu.

The present land situation is a combination of three previous properties known as the Bombini, San Jacinto and Shear McLean holdings, put together and presently controlled by Fury Explorations Ltd. (N.P.L.) of Vancouver, B.C. Cyprus may earn the right to an initial 70% by expenditures of \$500,000 and payments of \$112,000 over 5 years broken down as follows:

A further 10% would accrue to Cyprus on agreement to place the property into production. All pre-production costs would be returnable with interest, from the net profits of any successful mining venture.

WORK PROGRAM:

In view of the data coverage already available it is proposed to relocate the old surveys by means of well established terrain features and transfer the information to a common base on a new, contoured topographic map to be prepared from air photographs at a scale of 1" to 400".

It is considered that a series of short 300-500 foot percussion holes to a total of 4,000 feet should adequately test the tactite zone and adjacent intrusive as a source of a large open pit copper potential. Successful results would require further funds for diamond drilling and testing of possible extensions. Search for a replacement orebody of the Mother Lode type would be a secondary objective to be carried out if (a) the tactite zone does not fulfill expectations or (b) as a long term objective if the tactite zone exceeds expectations.

JUSTIFICATION:

The situation is of above average potential with possibilities for at least two types of orebody, in a classical old copper camp setting in which


ground has for many years been fractionated and not amenable to effective exploration. At present a well mineralized tactite zone appears to offer the best chance of success. Because of the good data base already in existence percussion drilling can be used to test the potential of the property both rapidly and cheaply. This and the excellent location of the ground with respect to transport, power and township facilities, in my opinion justifies the expenditures requested.
