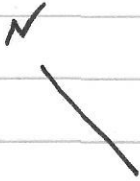

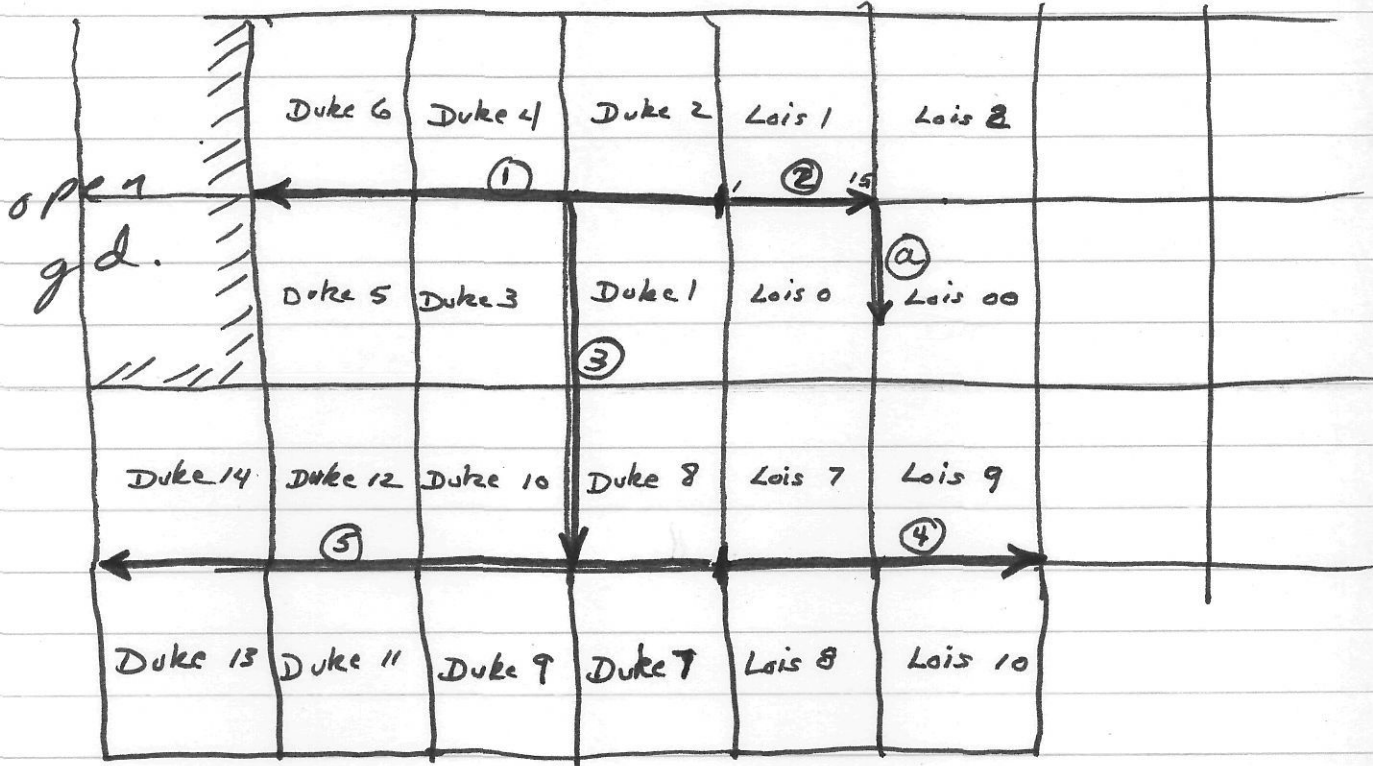
Conrad is staying at the Clifton Hotel on Granville Street, Vancouver. I told him we were not interested in the Potato Hills.

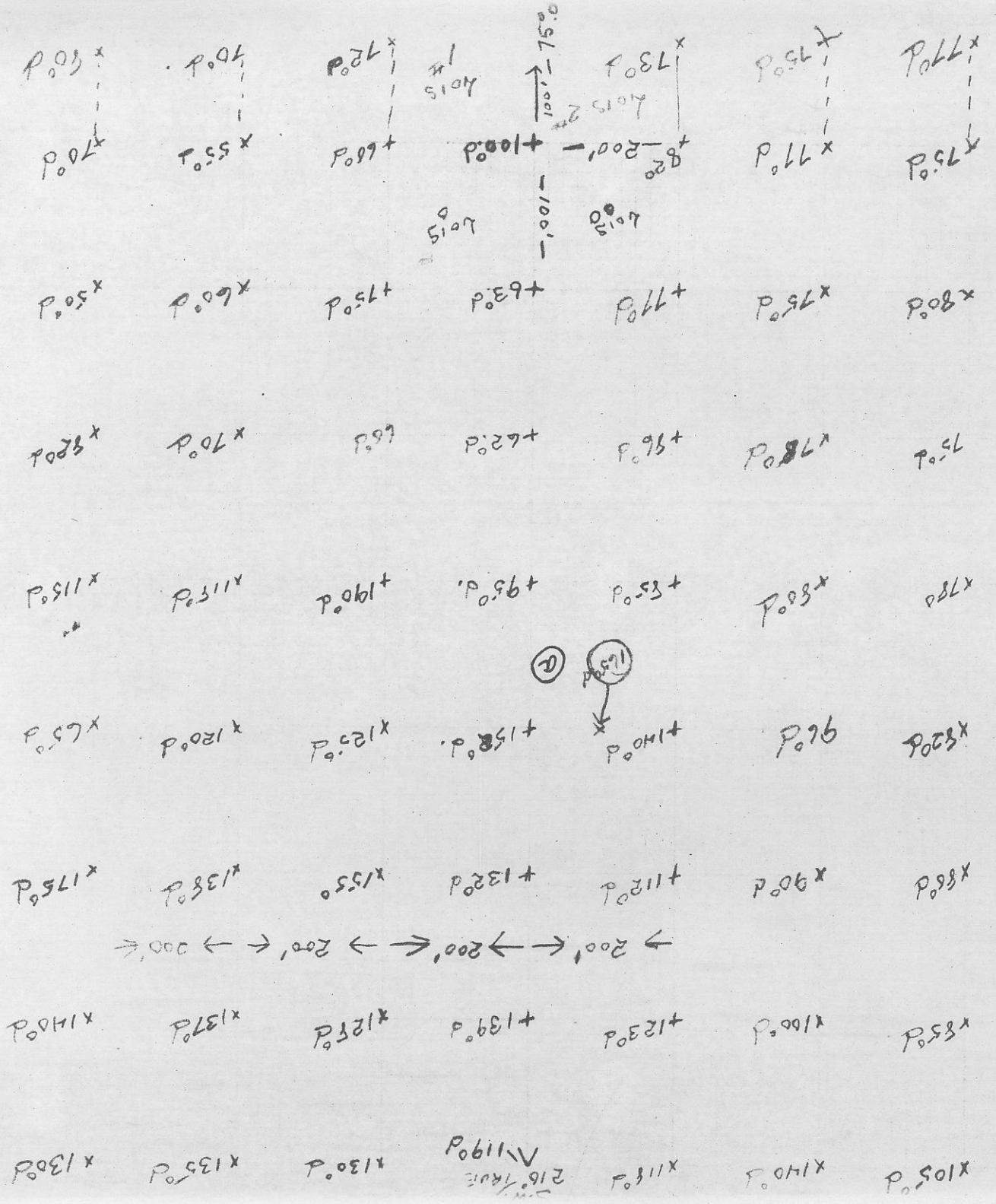
Jim King of Whitehorse (check Edgewater Beer Parlour) may have the only surviving geochem results from Conrad's King Mountain copper-nickel prospect in the Dease Lake country, where Conrad has 38 claims in the Duke and Lois claims and 12 nearby. The geochem reportedly went as high as 1650 ppm (or 600 ? ppm) copper and 800-900 ppm nickel. Felix Latain (now deceased) reported picking up 4 - 5% nickel samples of float in the vicinity of the Lois and Duke claims. All Conrad's claims in the King Mountain area are shown in purple on the attached claim map; they expire on or about June 25th, 1972. (The Potato Hills claims expire in late September 1972). Also attached are photocopies of claim notes and a dip needle survey on the King Mountain property by Conrad from his field notebook. On these 46 claims covering these two King Mountain nickel-copper prospects, Conrad's terms would be:

May 1, 1972	agree to keep up assessment work.
Oct. 1, 1972	payment of \$5,000
Oct. 1, 1973	payment of \$10,000
Oct. 1, 1974	payment of \$15,000
Oct. 1, 1975	payment of \$20,000
Oct. 1, 1976	payment of \$200,000

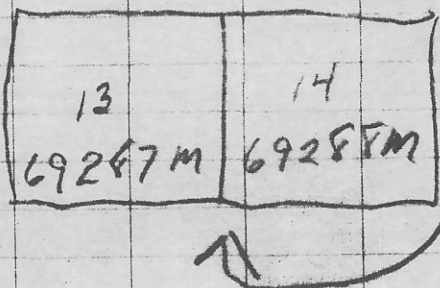

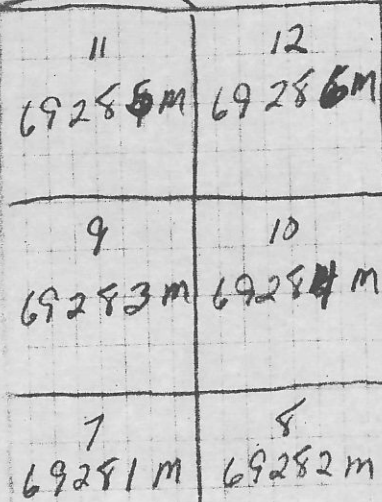

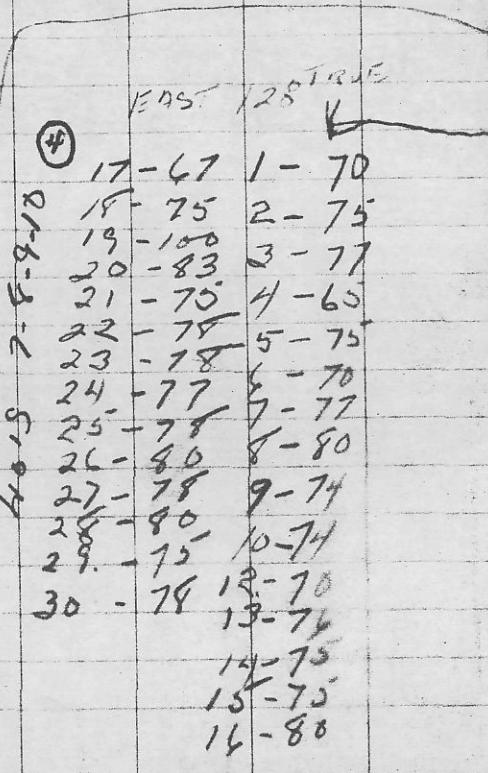


NW 360 TRAP

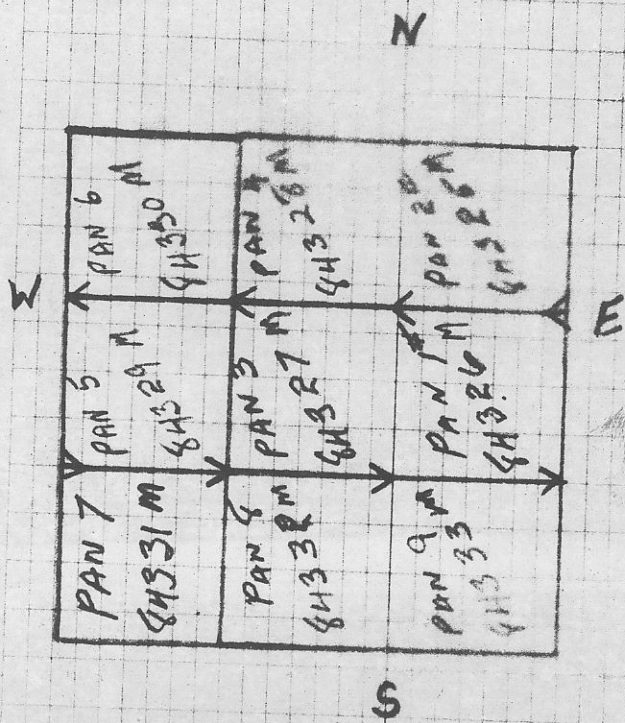
