PROPERTY: KING

COMMODITY: Copper

LOCATION: 58° 17' North, 129° 02' West, Liard Mining Division, B.C. The property is 37 miles due east of the south end of Dease Lake near the head of Bobner Creek, a tributary of Turnagain River. The claims are six miles south of the east end of Hard Lake.

ACCESS: From the village of Dease Lake, about 40 miles east by float plane to a lake on Turnagain River near the mouth of Bobner Creek; then about three miles northwest up the east side of Bobner Creek to the claims.

TOPOGRAPHY: Elevation 4500 - 5000 feet in timber and brush, very little outcrop.

PROPERTY: 4 claims in good standing until August 1975.

HISTORY: The claims were staked by El Paso as a result of prospecting in 1972, when reconnaissance soil sampling showed some anomalous zinc and copper values. Imperial Oil has an option on Spartan's Eagle claims, about three miles to the northwest.

GEOLOGY: The projected northwest trending contact between the Cassiar granodiorite and Lower Jurassic metasediments cuts across the claims. The prospector reported finding a showing of copper in intrusive rock as well as some copper float near the northeast corner of King #2 claim and also near the south edge of King #1 claim. Anomalous zinc values in the soils were obtained for about 1000 feet along the common boundary between King #3 and King #4 claims.

Imperial Oil has been drilling a long, narrow, low-grade copper porphyry on the Eagle claims in a similar environment.

CONCLUSIONS: A detailed soil sampling program including prospecting and geological mapping is required.
