Watson Lake Oct 28 - 1970

Dear Tim

Today a man come to me with a sample that he askt me to send to you "He have heard of the possibility of lowgrade moly"

He told me he have 8 claims stakt and recorded in a new area with good mineralization

I went to the recording office and got the map and I can see his is right about this been a new area. He is a whiteman his name Montana and this was his first season as a prospector. He want Atlas to have a look at his prospect but that is 6 miles of snow then now.

The place is 90 miles up Car Tung road and 1 1/2 mile of the road. I'm sending you the maps so you can see the area.

Andy Szabo was here and told Rite that he got a deal on his going up at 701. I was in the hills at the time and have not seen him since I got back. I made one trip about 25 N.E. from Watson to a gossan but was too late there was 56 claims stakt already. And I had the same luck on my next trip.

I have been thinking about our trip in to Beaver River country. As far as I can remember is a belt of granit running from Carbon S.S.E for about 30 miles to Jack Pine Lake, with the granit is real old, but at

The Lake where the gossan was where we was unable to land. There the granite is pebbles with pyrite. Long before I got interested in prospecting I had samples sent in to assay for gold from this place. one of the samples returned 0.17 gold. at the time \$6⁰⁰. but one of Con West's prospectors told me. gold in granite never. so I never recorded the claims but even today I can lay my hand on the rock where I took the sample. and this winter if things go right I might fly in and bring some more samples. then I will find out if I was salted.

These days I did not hunt gossans for minerals but for possible muskies where to kill meat for my dogs. There one more big gossan somewhere where we first landed. and another one about one mile before we got to the lake, where we was unable to land. And one about two miles from the last one we landed on. But the biggest one of all is about 10 miles down Beaver River from our last landing. I am sending the Murchie Lake map. I can't get the right one but this will do. The oil fields was found ^{near} market area. I am mailing the rocks today so you might get them in the same mail. If interested let me know. so I can tell MONTANA. And will you send the G.S.C. MAP back to me. Next time I run across them C.P. AIR Tickets. I will send them in
