Found Eldorado — Looking For An Angel

Two veteran prospectors from Fort Nelson, Bob Keays and Harris Davis, old timers to the area and those instrumental in the Churchill claims have just hit it rich with a fantastic Galena (silver, zinc, lead) find and bornite copper with tungsten.

The 40 claim solid block is within 120 miles of Fort Nelson adjacent to the highway and in an exposed outcropping in massive formation.

Six exposed veins of silver and four of copper are included in the find but it of course has not been determined to its full potential

They are in effect prospectors looking for an angel, are open to negotiations from all comers and word of their fantastic find has been passed along to the city dailies and mining circles.

Any one interested can look at it with a chopper providing they contact Harris or Bob and make the necessary arrangements. They have the entire area sewn up and registered in the local Mining district of Liard.

We have seen the certified assays.

Four samples show: No. 1.7.38 oz of silver to the ton, 64.1 per cent lead, and 2.2 % zinc Sample No 2 shows 5.94 ozs of silver to the ton, 60.5 lead and a trace of zinc. Sample 3 shows 7.24 ozs of silver to the ton, 73.5 % lead and .4 % zinc. Sample 4 shows .01 ozs of gold to the ton .11 ozs of silver to the ton and a mammoth 16. % copper. There are also traces of tungsten etc.

This is the first commercial galena found in Northern B.C. and the assay on the copper shows just as high grade as any on record,

The property has the potential of making a hell of a good mine and may after diamond drilling prove to be one of the levers used to hastening the extension of the P. G. E. Railway to Fort Nelson and beyond. This specified virgin area has never been prospected by man and the general area is not known to many.

This find could well spark a general prospecting or galena rush reminiscent of the Pine Point and Klondyke jobs and will be just one more bright star in our burgeoning economy.

The ore has only to be mined a road punched, a concentrator set up for the copper but the galena shipped in its native state then shipped to a smelter to be smelted down into its various components for a world hungry market.

This eldorado has the finders and the town understandably excited and further development will no doubt bear out the faith the mining fraternity holds with this newest illustrious find.

It is a new era for the Northern third of the province where Cassiar only has held sway to date.
