We have been actively exploring in the central and western parts of British Columbia for several years with considerable success. We are presently working on precious metal properties in the Terrace and Houston areas.

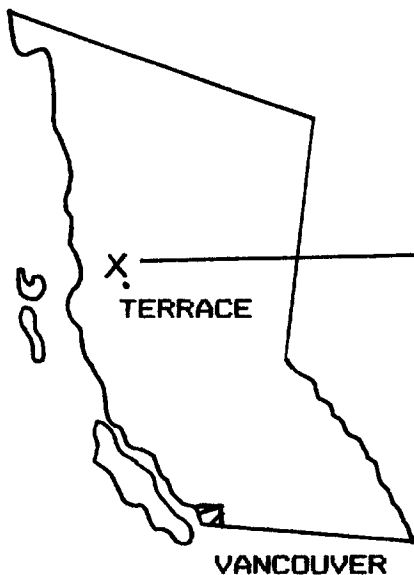

The veins that give these assays are 50 km from a town of 8,000 serviced by a transcontinental railroad, a paved highway and an all weather airport with daily flights to Vancouver. Logging roads are within 4 km and 138 KVA power is within 15 km.

Veins 50 to 100 cm wide are exposed for up to 30 meters and may be as long as 100 meters. Quartz ankerite zones around and adjacent to these veins have up to 0.89 OPT silver over 10 meters. Thirty-three units have been staked with assessment work recorded for 10 years on 4 key units.

The potential of this property is for high grade vein mining. Additional potential exists for bulk tonnages in the lower grade quartz-ankerite zones.
