Dear Sirs: Re The Mountain Boy Mine
Portland Canal Area
Skeena Mining Division
British Columbia.

The writer and my partner own the above property consisting of 26 Claims and in addition we have an interest in six Crown granted Mineral Claims adjoining in which we are in process of acquiring full title from two estates.

The property is on American Creek 13 miles by the Cassiar Highway from Stewart, B.C. then 3½ miles by an abandoned wagon road to the claims. The property is presently reached by Helicopter from Stewart.

During the period 1929-38 60 tons of Ore were shipped yielding 32,810 ozs Silver, 3,843 lbs Copper, 3,773 lbs Lead. Ore has assayed as high as \$ 600.00 per ton at pre world war 11 prices. Surface, underground and shipped ore samples show minor gold values, fair values in lead zinc and copper and high values in silver. There are good showings in Barite and Bornite and samples indicate the presents of Tungsten, but no assays of these showings are available.

The known viens, tunnels and open cuts run from an elevation of about 1500 feet to over 4000 feet, the property is in rugged country with heavy winter snows. Any examination of the property must be done between now and October.

This property was worked on during the late 1920's and 1930's when the depression and the second world war caused the cancellation of all further work. The property was held for years by anow defundt mining company. The writer after some effort secured title about three years ago, the mining climate in BC then became non-existent. It appears that with the increased value of silver, better base metal prices and the improved atmosphere in BC and the addition of the Cassiar Highway giving ready access that now is the time to develop the property. The writer who visited the property last summer with a prospector who had been on the property on several occasions was informed by the prospector that the property could become a second Premier Mine.

If you are interested in examining the property this summer I will only be to glad to forward a brief of the known reports on the property.
