Since that time John Sullivan working for clients has acquired numerous claims in this area and these claims are either close to or actually tied into Kennco claims. There has also been some staking by other companies.

We do not as yet know anything about the economics of these gold deposits, but it is interesting to see that Kennco continue to work in this area, and you will recall that they did not encourage visitors at the time that you and I visited Fred Chow's camp on Thutade Lake.

In summary, I don't believe that vein type deposits as such hold forth much promise despite increases in the price of gold, but the work being done by Kennco definitely bears watching since this type of deposit appears to justify continuing work on their part.
