

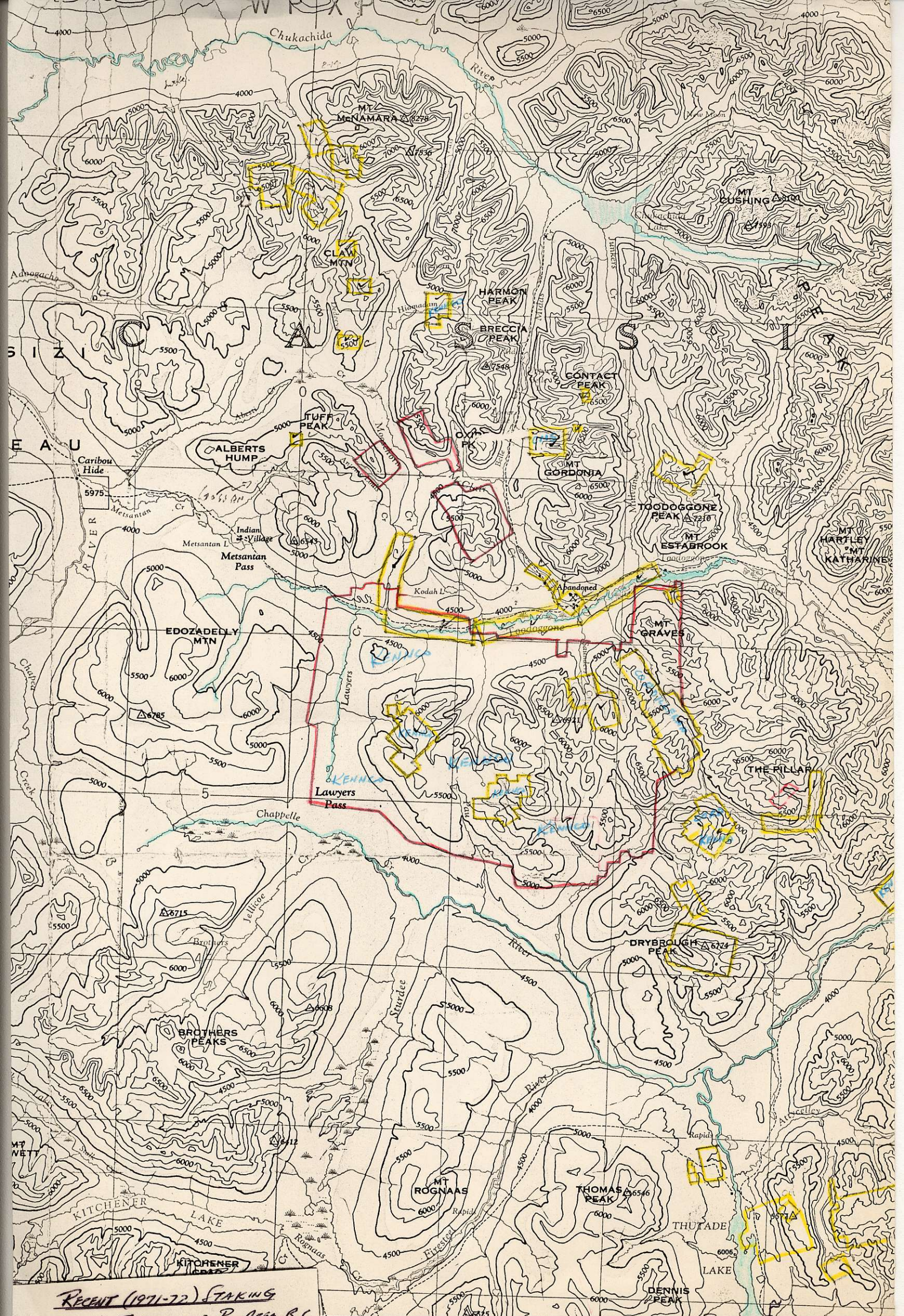

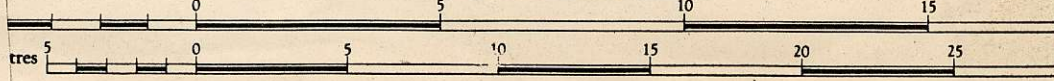
RECENT (1971-72) STAKING
