Mr. Anthony M. Arnold (4698 62nd Street, Delta, B.C. Ph. 604-946-4577) visited this office with Mr. Brian McDonough today. A group headed by Mr. Arnold holds a placer lease on the Lillooet River on the Fraser system in southern B.C. The lease is described as covering a favourable area a mile wide and four miles downstream. They have tested only $\frac{1}{2}$ mile downstream by pitting and some drilling. The gold content is estimated at about \$18.00/cubic yd. at \$150.00 gold with an average thickness of 8 feet. This would equate to an immediate potential of 1.7 million yards with a possible potential of 8 million yards.

The group is presently mining on a very limited scale with a loader and riffle system, producing about one ton of concentrate per day. To expand the operation, capital will be needed, but this is not their immediate concern.

Mr. Arnold would like to ship the concentrate to Kerr Addison for refining, and I expect he would agree to having us refine his concentrate F.O.B. Virginiatown at cost plus a small percentage (providing, of course, there are no objectionable constituents in his concentrate). This in effect could provide a bulk sample record of his product which would allow us to make a pretty good evaluation of the property keeping the possibility of acquisition in mind.

An 11-pound sample of concentrate estimated to contain about 1 lb. of gold was left with me. I have arranged to have X-Ray Laboratories run a series of assays on a portion of this sample for gold, silver, platinum group metals, iron and titanium. E. Brooker of X-Ray Labs may suggest other elements. This information will be passed on to Mr. Arnold, and we should shortly thereafter advise him as to whether we would be willing to refine his concentrate for him. The assaying will be done in a manner to give us some feel for reliability of sampling, by the way, and this would indicate what sampling procedure might be necessary in handling Mr. Arnold's concentrate.

Mr. Arnold did mention that he did not wish to deal with Cominco, nor an available small refining firm in Vancouver. He indicated that Cominco's terms were too stiff, and he felt the other group was cheating him. It should be borne in mind that such criticism could easily apply to Kerr Addison in due course, since these comments are really in the realm of opinion. However, he does seem to have a great deal of faith in Brian McDonough, who in turn, has a great deal of faith in Kerr Addison.
