Follow up check on Warstar Resources' Golden Sidewalk, Golden Belt and Alpha Extension Claims. Diamond Drilling Results.


Follow up investigation of the properties was prompted by Chris Sampson's view of possible low-grade, large tonnage potential for gold and silver in the wall rocks adjacent to the Goldbelt and Golden Sidewalk vein structures.

Chris Sampsons' drill logs recorded disseminated pyrrhotite and pyrite, without noting any estimated amount, in the andesitic and dacitic fragmental wall rocks. The rocks showed brecciation and silicification in parts, and minor veining and fracturing infilled with quartz, calcite, disseminated pyrrhotite, pyrite and often hematite.

All the core containing sulphides were analysed for Au & Ag and some of the core were analysed for Zn and sometimes also for Cu and/or Pb. None of the wall rock samples contain values of interest, usually in the range of about 0.001 to 0.01 oz Au/ton with an occasional 0.2 to 0.9<sup>m</sup> section assaying around 0.1 oz Au/ton.

It is concluded that the properties do not warrant additional work and therefore is of no further interest to Kerr Addison. Chris Sampson will be informed of our decision not to pursue further.

Contact by phone was made to Hans Guhr, President of Warstar Resources, who in turn advised us to get the results of the 1983 work program from Chris Samson, their consulting geologist. Chris will deliver a copy of his report to Kerr early next week.

A brief description of the 1983 year work and results, outlined by Chris, are as follows:

A 7-hole diamond drill program was conducted; 3 holes were drilled to investigate the Dauntless Vein on the Gold Belt claims, 3 holes to investigate the Peerless Vein on the Golden Sidewalk claims, and one hole was drilled in the Golden Sidewalk claim to check for extension of the Alpha Extension Vein structure.

The 3 holes on Gold Belt found minimal mineralization in the Dauntless Vein but intersected disseminated sulphides on both sides of the vein structure (shear zone). The country rock a greenstone is believed to be an andesitic flow containing pyrite up to 15% in places, and likely includes pyrrhotite. The rock is slightly magnetic. All the core containing sulphides were assayed for its gold content and the assays ranged from 0.01 to 0.09 oz Au per ton.

Three holes to check the Peerless structure gave no significant values. Pyrite mineralization was noted in the andesitic host rock though much lower in content than in the Dauntless zone. The 7th drill hole did not intersect the extension of the Alpha zone.

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Chris says Gerry Delane of Newmont had examined the drill core and may provide additional information regarding the rocks and mineralizations.
