I have recently acquired three promising gold prospects within about 100 miles of Vancouver. All have either gold showings or good gold soil geochemical anomalies, as outlined below:

1. BREW Claims - 16 units - 2000 foot long gold-arsenic anomaly.
2. SPRAY Claims - 11 units - 1981 drilling, 70 feet of 0.1 oz Au/ton.
3. FAULT Claims - 10 units - 1400 foot long altered fault zone with anomalous gold and arsenic values.

Summary information on these claims is attached. All are available for option under the terms presented in the summaries.


These claims, located 10 km south of Lillooet, were previously held by Duval and were restaked by Greg McKillop. See figures in McKillop's attached report.

Summary

Three reconnaissance "soil" (actually talus fines) lines across a scree slope located a Gold, to 120 ppb Au, As to 750 ppm, average 460 ppm, anomaly. The source of the anomaly is conjectured to be in the steep mountain side which extends 300 meters above the talus slope. The best results from rock sampling for Au were 75 ppb and 85 ppb, which appears to confirm my suggestion that Au is concentrated in talus fines.

Recommendation

We should decline the offer to option these claims, there are better and more developed properties available. I have told Greg that we have a program planned for the Lillooet area and may look at his ground but it is unlikely that we would option the Brew claims and he should contact other possible optioners.

Submitted by Greg McKillop, 980 8853, who was with Duval, Vancouver, until they closed.

These claims, located 31 km south west of Lytton, were previously held by Duval and were restaked by Greg McKillop. See figures in McKillop's attached report.

Summary

Rock and soil geochemistry indicate a 450 m long zone of anomalous Au and As associated with a north east trending fault. The fault trace is in a steep walled creek canyon, which contains several narrow quartz ± carbonate veinlets over a 1 meter gange zone which banded by on either side a 10-15 meter alteration zone. A 6 meter chip sample of the alteration zone returned 15 ppm Ag and 395 ppb Au.

In discussing these claims with Greg he said the target is very small and very difficult of access and is not really a very attractive prospect for a larger mining company. I agree.

Recommendation

We have declined the offer to option these claims.

These claims, located 16 km south of Lillooet, were previously held and drilled by Duval, and were restaked by Greg McKillop. See figures in McKillop's attached report.

Summary

Duval was exploring the area for moly between 1978 and 81 and during the course of that work drilled 4 holes in an area of chloritization, sericitization, biotization and intense silicification. The results of the moly exploration are available in assessment reports. Some of the samples were analyzed for Au and in one hole [C81-4] a 21 meter interval (36 to 57 M) averaged 3670 ppb based on 3 meter samples, with a high of 7860 ppb over a 3 meter interval.

A Duval report (pg 5, Dec 22, 1981) suggests this 21 meter interval has a true width of 6.9 meters, based on surface mapping. There are no quartz vein angles in the drill log but the silicification is intense throughout the hole, 20 - 50 quartz veins per meter! Only hole C 81-4 was oriented to intercept the 300° trending swarms of quartz veins located in the surface mapping.


Conclusions

The potential for a large tonnage, low grade [3 to 6 gram/tonne] bulk mineable deposit in a silicified quartz diorite is indicated on the Spray claims.

Recommendation

Examine the claims as soon as the snow melts.
