MIDWAY DEPOSIT Stratelona Minerals Ltd.

The Midway manto deposit is located just south of the Yukon Territory border and 85 kilometres (53 miles) west of Watson Lake. It is accessible by road from the Alaska Highway.

The 1990 exploration programme consisted of extending the underground workings by decline from the Silver Creek zone to the Discovery zone. More than 5000 metres (16,000 feet) of underground drilling was completed in 1990 to test the Discovery zone.

The deposit is hosted by McDame Group carbonates and occurs immediately below the contact with the Earn Group shale. The mineralization consists of an irregular system of pipes filled with pyrite, sphalerite, galena, pyrrhotite, friebergite, arsenopyrite, pyrargyrite, tin and lead sulphosalts. Early 1980 drilling resulted in estimated geological reserves of 1.185 million tonnes (1.3062 million tons) grading 410 grame silver per tonne (11.97 ounces silver per ton), 9.6 per cent zinc and 7 per cent lead within the Discovery and Silver Creek zones.

Midway is considered to be at the advanced exploration stage of development.
