Dear Ted:

Enclosed is a sample of asbestos given me by Ed Asp, one of the Asp brothers, Dease Lake from their showing. We had previous information re this showing: it was the one that they wanted a sum of money prior to looking at it.

I think it is good fibre: Roots looked at it and is reported to have said it is No 1 fibre. There is only one outcrop area, and recent work done by the Asps has apparently not uncovered anything in the way of an extension.

I also think there is a possibility it may have come from Cassiar: but nothing definite to back this up.

At any rate, I arranged to make an examination next spring, and I'll check up on the Asp bros' claim holdings when I get down to the coast,

Dear Ted:  
The day after I wrote you requesting the information on this rumor, I ran into Pete Riordon and Robby Robinson of Asbestor Corp. Robinson has been on the Mexican Asbestos showing that his company optioned early this spring, which they have been drilling. Though they did not say so, I gather they are not so bullish on that deposit as they were when the deal was signed. Recall that it is a tidewater deposit and a very stiff deal for Asbestos was signed in securing the option.

I showed Riordon the asbestos sample secured from Henry Asp. Pete says the only fibre he can recall they say two years ago in the area was on the head of Meth Creek and none of it was over 3-8 inches. He thinks this is good fibre altho he noted that it is quite short.

Other than that, Pete recalls that he financed one of the Taku Jack family with a grubstake to go into the area to bring out asbestos samples and nothing came of it.

I have your wire re the "snakes". If the opportunity comes up to examine the showing, will do so,

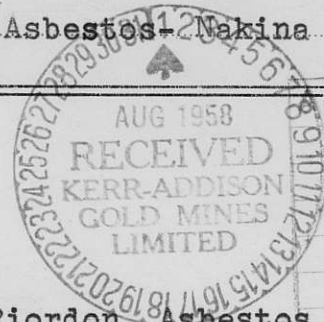

Dear Ted:

Would you please contact Pete Riordon, Asbestos Corp- preferably in person and ask him if he recalls if their search in that area resulted in any find within say five miles of that lake.

I have seen some fibre that is less than 3/4 inch tho more than 3/8 on the average: is tough, green and clean and inclined to be brittle. The location of the find is supposed to be vicinity of Nakina L. but it may be between that Lake and the head of the Cottonwood, tho I think it is in the vicinity of Nakina Lake.

There are three outcrops, in a 300 x 300 ft area on a side hill in a slide but the finder insists the samples are from outcrops that project thru the slide material. The host rock for the fibre is black lustrous serpentine and the "head size" piece I saw contained four fractures with fibre in them. This is supposed to be representative and I noted the loose fibre samples were longer than the fibre in the rock sample.

The Asp brothres of Dease L state they ~~are supposed to~~ have made the find and I have offered to examine it; if the information from Riordon is not readily forthcoming, it is not too important.
