Re: BIK SYNDICATE

In 1958 we found a large shear in Sphaler Creek containing some copper mineralization, but a preliminary examination did not reveal any extensive showings of copper. However, because of increased interest in the area, a group of ten claims (Kim 1-10) were located by myself in August 1962.

During 1963 Kennco did some work in the area and staked a group of 48 claims which overlap the Kim claims. Upon finding that they had done this, Jack Gower of Kennco approached Silver Standard with a proposal to amalgamate the two groups. Kennco claims there are 5 mineralized zones within the 48-claim group, one of which is on the Kim claims.

They have suggested that an agreement be drawn up giving 80% interest to Kennco and 20% interest to the BIK Syndicate and the interests to be maintained in this ratio only if the money for later expenditures is supplied in the same ratio.

Undoubtedly negotiating an agreement will take considerable time and, of course, a draft will be submitted to you for approval. In the meantime, an effort will be made to have a more comprehensive examination carried out on the property. Possibly one of your engineers would be available to do this. I believe we can arrange to get one of Kennco's helicopters which are in the area.

Any suggestions or assistance which you can give will be appreciated.
