Bill Buchholz has brought me a showing discovered while prospecting in the ~~Stikine~~ ^{Canover} area. No one has seen this showing except Bill, an oldtimer that is now dead, and Bill's helper.

Bill meant to return to this area and do more prospecting, but he is worried about the recent activity at Stikine Copper since this is uncomfortably close to his prospect.

The prospect is located at approximately Latitude 57° 40' Longitude 131° 32' just north of Canover Creek at the 3400' elevation along the edge of a ridge just outside the heavy timber. There are 5 very old trenches exposing veins of galena and sphalerite cutting the formation heading down the mountain into the timber. Veins vary from 5 feet to 9 feet in width and there is an old trail that goes to each showing. The showings are spread over 1500 feet in palaeozoic rocks. There is a sheared rust zone parallel to these showings that is approximately 40 feet in width that was never checked for commercial minerals. This could be important and Bill wanted to check it out. There are also other numerous rust zones that can be seen from the air that were never checked for commercial minerals, and Bill feels that a Geophysical survey below the timber line would likely pick up something of real significance.

The last claim map shows staking on Canover Creek above the mentioned showings. He doubts that anyone knows about this showing since there was no indication of anyone prospecting in the area when he was there and no engineer, to his knowledge, ever examined it.

Bill would like a 10% interest in the claims that we may stake in this location.

Please find enclosed Bill Buchholz's personal Geology map, Topographical map, a sample from one of the showings, and an assay result from the trenches. If we do not proceed with any examination of this prospect, he would like this returned to me as soon as possible.

I have known Bill for quite a while and he is very reliable. He has sold one claim group to C. M. & S. in the Stikine area and they are very anxious to examine any of his prospects, but on account of long standing friendship with me, he has brought this prospect to us.
