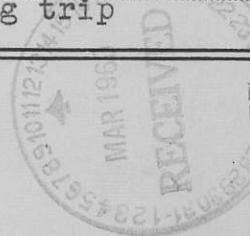

Dear Ted:

The 'first refusal' arrangement with Jghn Graham and Wilf Zacharias was as you interpreted it. I did not think the prospect warranted a grubstake deal, and they did not want to be tied up and prevented from selling the claims in the event we did not propose to do any development work on them.

Had they staked, we could have the claims on a simple purchase deal.
