Subject Glossie Mines Limited (92-I/11 E) Date November 7/68
Suite 906 - 357 Bay Street, Toronto, Ontario.

The above named company owns 4 Crown Granted claims in the northwest sector of the Guichon Creek Batholith. These Crown Grants are the Forge, the Glossie, the Glossie Fraction and Cindar. Perhaps it would expedite matters if you could give these people a call and tell them that we would like to examine the property with a view to optioning this ground together with the surrounding claims.

The surrounding claims do not belong to Glossie Mines but belong to a Mr. M. P. Stadyk of Kamloops, B.C. We will make it our business to contact this gentleman. His claims are the Blue 1 - 8; the Joy 1 - 15, and the Joe 1 - 15.

The Glossie claims have been developed by one 100-foot shaft and two 40-foot shafts. Presumably these were driven on narrow bornite veins which contained a fair amount of silver in places. By a fair amount I mean anywhere from Trace up to 25 oz. This is of no particular significance but I am intrigued by the fact that all of the promising properties in the Highland Valley with the exception of Valley Copper have had similar old workings on narrow veins.

Would you please contact or have someone else contact the Glossie people as soon as possible so that we can proceed with an examination if the ground has not already been optioned to someone else.

I could add that we know nothing of the geology except that a 1915 report claims that the rock type is a granite.
