FIRST ASSAY RESULTS

DRILL PROGRAM ON GRANITE Mtn. - Long Lac Mineral Explorations Ltd. has completed two of a five hole drill program on a property on Granite Mountain, near Princeton, B.C. and held under option from Northern Lights Resources Ltd. Assays have been received for diamond drill holes 4-80 and 1-80.

D.D.H. 4-80 was drilled to 163 feet, bearing N75°E at a -45° dip. The collar is 25 feet north and 50 feet west of the adit portal. Assays from 84 feet to 103 feet, a true width of 11.0 feet, returned 0.066 oz. gold per ton and 0.388 oz. silver per ton.

D.D.H. No. 1-80 was drilled to 243 feet, bearing N75°E at a -45° dip. The collar is 150 feet N15°W of DDH 4-80. Assays from 124.5 feet to 132.0 feet, a true width of 5.2 feet, returned 0.002 oz. gold per ton and 0.08 oz. silver per ton. This intersection is in the same zone as in DDH 4-80.

Results from the remaining three holes in the present drilling program will be reported when completed.

Long Lac Mineral has agreed to spend \$25,000 on the property in return for an option to earn a 50% property interest. To earn the 50% interest Long Lac Mineral has the option to spend \$1,000,000 on the ground at the rate of \$75,000 per year. There are provisions for reducing the working interests of the parties for failure to contribute.

A second phase diamond drilling program has started on the Barbara gold-silver property held by Northern Lights Resources Ltd. and located 120 miles southeast of Reno, Nevada, near Mono Lake, Mono county, east central California. Each of the current holes is planned to be drilled to 200 feet. They are directed to test the depth of a mineralized gold-silver shear sampled by the company consultant with the following results: 0.138 oz. gold/t and 3.58 oz. silver/t across 1.5 ft. and 0.132 oz. gold/t and 0.25 oz. silver/t across 6.0 feet. These samples were from winzes 150 feet apart on a structure which has been traced over a 600-foot length.

DEAL MADE ON PROPERTY NEAR PRINCETON, B.C. By an agreement subject to regulatory approval, Northern Lights Resources Ltd. have granted Long Lac Mineral Explorations Ltd., for \$25,000, an option to acquire 50% interest in 4 mineral claims and two 20-unit mineral claims in Similkameen mining division, which Northern Lights have the right to explore.

Long Lac have agreed to spend up to \$1,000,000 at the rate of \$75,000 per year during the option period to acquire the 50% working interest and the right to manage operations on the property.

There are provisions for reducing the working interests of the parties for failure to contribute and for Long Lac to recoup their expenditure of \$1,000,000 out of the first net proceeds from operations.
