An option, dated October 17th, 1960 was secured by Prospectors Airways Company Limited on a group of eight claims named the Shot 1-8 incl, together with certain fractional claims from Donald S. Patterson, of Winnipeg Man., owner of the claims. Under the terms of the option agreement, the company agreed to make a thorough examination of the claims, which examination, it was decided would be in the form of a sensitive magnetometer survey. This report deals mainly with the results of this examination.

History:

This claim group, originally staked as the Jim group, by John James McMahon, of Vancouver, was held under option during 1958 and 1959, by Noranda Explorations Limited. Surface prospecting, including a minor amount of trenching, and a reconnaissance form of magnetometer survey was undertaken and the option was allowed to lapse.

In July, 1959, McMahon sold the group to Patterson for Five Thousand Dollars and 5% of the profits of mining or sale of the claims, in the event Patterson resold the group. Patterson optioned the claims to Prospectors Airways Co Ltd, in October 1960.

Property:

The group of claims subject to this recent examination, consists of the following located claims:

Geology:

The surface of this claim group is completely masked by recent sake bottom-gravels; the surface profile from east to west E.O.C. and south to north is a series of benches or stream terraces; a number of 'kettles' to depths of fifty to 75 feet fail to expose the underlying rocks. The sub-surface rock types are not known, but from mapping west and north of the group, it is estimated that, at a depth of approx. two hundred feet, Nicola volcanics and sediments underly the claims. The same mapping, done by Noranda, indicates the contact between the Nicola rocks and granites of the Guichon batholith occurs approximately 400 ft west of the boundary of Shot No 2 mineral claim.

Surface cover:

Red-pine and others of the same variety occur scatterd over the surface of the claims. Brush growth is confined to the surface run-off depressions. Growth is so limited it was necessary to picket the survey lines.

Magnetometer survey:

A sensitive magnetometer survey was made of the claims commencing October 28th on lines at four hundred ft intervals, stations at 100 ft intervals, on north south lines. \$3,000 ft of surveying was completed, using an Askania A-2 magnetometer having a 2.4 gamma per scale division. Magnetic drift was determined at the start, at noon, and at the end of each day of surveying. Survey lines were established from a previously surveyed eastwest base line on the south boundary of the group. The survey was adjusted at a secondary base line 4500 ft north of the south base line.

Magnetometer station readings varied from 6458 gammas to 7470 gammas; 95% of the readings taken recorded between 6600 and 7000 gammas. No significant magnetic anomolies were indicated by the survey. Contouring of the results obtained suggested the magnetic countours simply record the topo. contours and the 'kettkes' and depressions, bench fronts and slopes on the surface of the claims.

Dear Ted:

J.I.B. Alex Burton and self plotted the results of the E.C.J. the sensitive magnetometer survey on the Shot claims, on Wed and on Thursday, we attempted to contour it. It cannot be contoured sensibly. The general gamma level both on the Shot and Etta groups is 6200 - 6300; the highest gamma reading obtained was 7000-7100 on the boundary between Shot No 2 and Hazel No 2; hwever, we think that these readings are due to topographic highs, and further, the readings on the lines east and west of this line 7600 East indicate this is an isolated high.

The instrument reacts very quickly to changes in elevation: readings taken thru any 'kettle' or depression with a 50-75 ft depth show variations from 200 to 400 gammas.

Today, Burton is plotting what contouring we were able to do and he is making up a composite map of the survey on the Etta and the Shot claims for your files. A copy will go to Duncan Crone asking his opinion.

Kennecott have dones number of similar Askania surveys in the Merritt area and feter Hirst tells me they have systematically elimenated most of the anamolies found as topographic anomolies.

The results of the survey should be ready to go forward to you by tomorrow night: I'll check on the filing of this survey for assessment purposes but will not file same until I get a confitmation from you,

Dear Ted:

The details overleaf appear to cover the matter of the claims within this option. The Forms B for the JJM fr claims arrived yesterday, were passed to McMahon, who will presumably transfer them to Patterson thru his lawyer, here.

I should have a progress report on the mag svy by tonite and will be in Merritt early next week before Burton completes the initial 50,000 ft of line.

As you are probably aware, Burton recently completed a similar svy on the Etta Group which adjoins to the west of the Shot and I understand, the preliminary results of this work did not indicate any significant anomalous conditions. From a brief examination of the notes on this survey, the range of the readings was less than 200 gammas over the area surveyed. Alex estimates this type of variation could be caused by placer concentrations of magnetite sands in old watercourses.

Next: if the mag svy is not significant, . does Ted Chisholm want any other tests made on these claims? Overburden is of the order of 50 ft or better so stripping us not practical, but should I investigate the practicability of gravity svying? An organization here, Burroughs Geophysics, of Spokane, are trying to break into the contract geo-physics business in B? C. If they are willing to run a few experimental lines, at their own expense, with the possibility of getting a contract, if competative, do you think we should make such an arrangement?

I will run a few E.M. lines over the Shot claims, for our own information, but, tests on Craigmont showed this system was not successful.



Don Patterson's terms received by letter yesterday and a copy is attached.

I must admit it was a bit of a shock to find that they were so much more than the verbal discussions I had with you in Winnipeg. The main difficulty is the amount of cash involved and the limited amount of time to do work in what has proved to be very difficult country to drill. That is why I suggested you give us ample time to do a detailed magnetometer survey and take a higher stock interest of half the vendors position. (This would amount to 450,000 shares in a five million share company.)

The property is essentially a long shot risk as you know. The west edge of your property lies exactly 10,000 feet on strike from the known east end of the Craigmont orebody as known and surveyed. Craigmont and Noranda Exploration both hold claims intervening. They have not done much work yet on this intervening ground and very little is apparent due to the overburden. The airborne magnetic on this section and over your claims is flat. This may be due to the overburden, however, I am convinced a detailed ground magnetometer survey should be done on your ground. Noranda did a dip needle type of survey on your ground which was flat but the overburden is too deep to place reliance on the results. A sensitive Askani survey could possibly reach down 300 feet. All indications on your ground are that the overburden is in

excess of 150 feet and perhaps more. This is projected from a Noranda hole on claims adjoining yours to the north. Another factor that adds to the risk there is the line of the north-south creek between your ground and Craigmont. This is believed to be a fault with a north-south throw that may cut off the EN extension of Craigmont. To add to the complications it is now known that magnetic anomalies occur in the barren granites to the north and the overlying barren Kings-vale sediments to the south. So the presence of a magnetic anomaly even requires testing by drilling. This is quite expensive in this country as 6 inch Tricone Bit holes have to be drilled to bedrock and cased before diamond drilling can be done properly.

I am not crying poor to discourage you as I think you have a favourably located group of claims that require more work. However, a realistic appraisal of the known facts shows that it is a "long shot" proposition on which adequate time is required to do a thorough test.


I don't quarrel with Don Patterson's statement that other companies or brokerage houses might put up cash (though not gladly!) for the privilege of drilling, but I am sure they would be looking at the property from a market angle and would not do the property justice technically. 

After having a talk today with Mr. McCallum, I feel that my ideas regarding the Kamloops property were somewhat impractical. Mac and I both agree that the following would be okay with us, and if you feel like going ahead on the basis of the following four points, just drop us a line. Our ideas are as follows:

- 1. We will grant to Prospectors Airways an option for sixty days to drill or do geophysic work without payment of any cash.

How did the lead prospect look to Rod and is it worth while putting in a drill hole or two and are you going to follow up Millers gold, silver lead prospect, or do you think it is worth while putting a drill hole or two in this? The timber has been taken over by a logging company Creelman tells me.
