

**Ram 1-2 Claims**

The Ram property is located on the Nechako Plateau approximately 120 kilometres southwest of Vanderhoof.

The Ram 1-2 claims lie approximately 27 kilometres southeast of the Capoose deposit (see above for description). The property is underlain by a sequence of Lower to Middle Jurassic Hazelton Group andesitic volcanics with minor epiclastic sediments which have been intruded by later felsic dykes, possibly feeders to the Tertiary Ootsa Lake rhyolites. No definitely stratified felsic rocks are seen on the property. The epiclastic sediments contain 2-3% finely disseminated pyrite.

Mineralization occurs as sphalerite-bearing mafic lapilli tuffs and interbedded sediments. It is generally poddy and occurs in close proximity to rhyolite outcrops. Up to 25% pyrrhotite and strong chlorite-silica alteration accompanies the zinc mineralization. Arsenopyrite is present in one sample from the 1992 exploration program. Two areas of mineralization are known on the property. Several rock samples from one area were strongly anomalous for zinc (5610 ppm Zn, 3.3% Zn, 2330 ppm Zn, 8950 ppm Zn, 1460 ppm Zn and 2180 ppm Cu, 8850 ppm Zn, 4740 ppm Zn). Other base and precious metal values were generally low. The second area of significant mineralization is located in the southeast corner of the property, covering an area of 200x300 metres and consisting of potassium feldspar, chlorite, epidote and garnet alteration with variable amounts of specular hematite, magnetite, pyrite and chalcopryrite with local breccia and veins of skarnified material containing massive to semi-massive pyrite and magnetite. Samples from this area returned weakly anomalous Au, Ag, Cu, and Zn values.

A 400x600 metre wide band of low order Cu-Zn-Pb-As soil anomalies was discovered in the area but no extensive zones of economic mineralization have been uncovered thus far. No geophysics or drilling has been done. Access to the property is restricted to helicopter or ATV from a camp approximately 20 km to the east.

Recommendation: Decline.
