Attached are a memorandum dated March 21st, 1961 by Sirola on this 20 claim copper property located some 25 miles north of Williams Lake in the Caribou District. The property was submitted to Sirola by Vancouver Consulting Geologist J. S. Scott on behalf of A. Berglund, the owner of the property. Scott's letter to Sirola with attached data are also attached to this memorandum.

Based on the fact that a considerable amount of work in the general area has produced no commerical deposits, Sirola is not overly enthused by the possibilities in the property. He, Wilton, and I all consider that the \$3,000 down payment being requested is too high.

I recommend that Sirola should advise Scott or Berglund that the terms of the deal are unacceptable but that he would like permissions to examine the property later this spring or early this summer in order to gain a personal first-hand impression of it and of the local area.

Jim Scott, who represents Dennison Mines in Vancouver, has sent me a Key Map and an Electro-Magnetic Map on the above property. These are enclosed for your perusal. The anomalies shown on the Electro-Magnetic Map are interesting and certainly could represent mineralization. By the same token, they could represent a North West Fault-Zone running through Cuisson Lake.

A considerable amount of work has been done in the general area but no commercial deposits have been found.

On the Pollyanna Ground on the East Central portion of the Location Map there is a shear zone in Grano-Diorite striking North 30° West and dipping 45° North East. The shear is 230° wide and pyrite and chalcopyrite occur in irregular quartz stringers within the shear.

On the Sunset Property at Granite Creek, similar mineralization occurs over a width of 100' in Schistose Grano-Diorite. Ten diamond drilled holes, totalling 3,000', were drilled in 1959. There is an exploration adit 110' long which was sampled by the B.C. Department of Mines in 1957. The best assay was $12\frac{1}{2}$ ' of 1.43% copper. An open cut West of the Portal gave 23' of 0.87% Cu.

Since the anomaly on the Atlas and Axis Groups is centred in a small lake, drilling would have to be done very soon.

I am not overly enthused by the general possibilities of the area and I do not recommend work under the conditions stipulated in Mr. Scott's letter.

Kindly advise me if you concur and we can then return the data to Mr. Scott.
