
Dear Mr. Sheather:

Subject New Wellington Mines Limited, Date August 20, 1968.
Menard Creek Property, 56° 45' N - 126° 35' W

I have reviewed the reports and maps of this property which were submitted by Mr. Sheather on Friday, August 16th.

New Wellington owns 141 contiguous claims located about 185 miles northwest of Ft. St. James. Access is by an all-weather road from Ft. St. James through Germansen Landing to Usilika, a distance of 145 miles. A "cat" road, 105 miles long, connects the property with Usilika Lake. Small aircraft are able to land on Thorne Lake, 7 miles from the property.

Copper mineralization and minor molybdenite occur as fracture fillings and in shears in the volcanic rocks and to a lesser extent, in quartz-feldspar porphyry. The mineralization is approximately 3,000 feet west of a north-south trending granodiorite mass. Elsewhere on the property, small dikes and plugs of quartz monzonite occur and minor amounts of molybdenite and chalcopyrite have been found.

A limited amount of I.P. work was done for New Wellington by McPhar Geophysics in August, 1967. No strong I.P. effects were encountered but drilling was recommended on a number of weak I.P. anomalies on four lines. The anomalies are designated "possible to probable" and cover a length of 2,000 feet in a north-south direction. The "probable" anomalies have a width averaging approximately 150 feet.

I do not recommend work on this property because of mediocre showings in an area largely devoid of transportation.

Quite apart from my own conclusions, we must also live with the thought that the property has been examined by various other interests in the past. These include Amex and Mitsui.

I approved this negative recommendation about noon on Aug 16th after Sirola reported his morning visit from Mr. Sheather.
