Dear Sir : -

Thanks for your letter of Nov. 23/66. - Re- the zinc showing.

My partner was here today, and left me some samples from the showing which I will mail to you. He has been doing some trenching up there the past summer along with another prospector, and gives me the information herein.

It appears to be a replacement deposit, with vertical dip running east and west, by strike. The mountain is very steep, and the elevation is at about 5000 ft above sea level. However, there is a logging road less than half a mile from the showing, where a steep trail leads from. The location is on Crusader Creek, tributary of Lemon Creel near here. (See map. Gold Reef Mineral Claim.)

This Gold Reef was staked by my late Father in 1914, and was worked in a small way for free gold ore, in 1914, and again with a small ball-mill in 1922, but he did not discover the zinc. Harold Avis and Wm. Dyson, local prospectors were digging a pool to divert water for surface stripping, and found the low grade zinc which the sharp creek draw follows. The gold vein which was worked is ~~XXXX~~ 500 feet away in a diagonal direction, and is also dipping quite steeply. The gold must have been in pods, as we cannot find any more, but the quartz vein is still there. There is a 12 inch vein on the opposite side of the zinc zone right on the same strike as the main quartz vein. We figure the quartz vein must intersect the 17 foot zinc deposit at about a 45 degree angle. - My partners want me to supply them with a Cobra plugger, when they would trench the shear laterally next spring. Snow stays there into mid May and is about a foot deep there at this date. The old Crusader claims are about a mile or so S.W. - now held by the MacMillans I believe. (George & Viola.)

Avis and Dyson tell me they discovered similar rock, heavily eroded 1000 feet further up the mountain on strike, but overburden was heavy, and the granite there was decomposed to some depth. They accomplished very little with pick and shovel.

This hill is the location of the old Gold Wedge, -a pockety gold property worked between 1900 and 1905, and where pockets of jewelry gold was found, but it went broke finally. No-one ever found zinc hereabouts before.

If there is any other information you wish, please advise me.

My wife and myself and daughter prospect in North Saskatchewan every summer - since 1956 - so we are away from here when weather is suitable to work on claims. - Mr. Campbell investigated a uranium showing north of Lake Athabasca last September, and a gold show 80 miles north of LaRonge, -for Kerr/Addison.

This zinc is a little bad to get up to, except in snowless seasons, but if you contact either of the two men mentioned above, -both live at WINLAW, B.C. R.R.#1, they will supply transportation and act as guide etc, to the showing.

Trusting this letter will be of some use for the time being,

Dear Mr. Hird:

We have been advised by our Mr. Jim Campbell that you have been working on a Zinc deposit 60 miles from Trail. Campbell advises only that you have a showing 150 feet in length and 17 feet in width assaying 3.04% Zinc and 0.6% Lead. I am not clear from his memorandum whether or not this is strictly a vein type deposit or whether there is replacement mineralization. Campbell made no mention of Silver values which are usually associated with Lead and Zinc.

If your showing is a replacement deposit, I would appreciate hearing any details you might care to provide.

me that he and his friends have a showing 4 miles from his cabin at Slocan City. The showing lies 2 miles from the highway, 60 miles from Trail and 30 miles from Reeves MacDonald Mine.

They have trenched this showing for 150 feet in length and 17 feet in width. Chip assay across the vein gave 3.04% zinc and .6% lead.

This property should be looked at within the very near future. The snow has not hit their area up to the present.

Dear Sir -

Last winter my partner, E. H. Stid of Slovan City sent you some samples of our claim near Slovan. These were poor samples so I am taking the privilege of sending you some more.

Some of these are from apparently stringer veins from the main lead.

We have done a little more work and it is looking more promising.

The vein is 16-17 feet in width, almost perpendicular walls.

It is under overburden and capped with granite. In places the effect of gases show on the surface leaving the granite stained and burnt.

We trace this to an estimated 3000 to 4000 feet and it is still going.

This is a gold area. An early gold mine worked here in the early days

our property. A good road leads
out to the main highway.

We feel this showing is for an
exploration company's attention.
