PATHFINDER - LITTLE BERTHA GROUP -

consists of the following 3 leased claims:

Situated about 14 miles north of Grand Forks at an elevation of 3,500 feet. There is a fairly good road right to the workings. These claims have been worked intermittently since 1896 and there is now more than 350 ft. of shaft work and over 1,000 ft. of tunnelling.

On the Pathfinder claim there are 4 nearly parallel veins varying in width from 1.5 ft. to 13 ft. A limited amount of diamond drilling done several years ago showed 5 ft. intersections assaying as high as 1.2 oz. gold /ton and 1.95% copper /ton.

An additional 1000 ft. of diamond drilling might prove up the ore on the Pathfinder. Less than 1000 ft. of drilling might establish the vein continuity on the Little Bertha.

There is a customs mill within 35 miles which handles copper ore.

LAKEVIEW GROUP -

consists of the leased Lakeview Claim L-1802 and 4 staked claims adjoining it on the south. A good road leads to the claims which are situated about 1 mile due east of Slocan about 500' above Springer Creek.

Workings consist of a 15' shaft and an adit about 325' long. All the machinery from the 10-15 ton flotation mill has been removed and most of the buildings have fallen down.

A quartz vein varying in width from 3" to 42" has been traced for over 1,000'. Although outcrops are infrequent overburden near the workings is less than 5' deep. "Disseminated sulphide mineralization occurring in quartz and the altered wall-rock appeared to reach a maximum width of about 6 ft.". Mineralization consists of pyrite, chalcopryite, galena, and sphalerite with some chalcocite and covellite and possibly a little native silver.

From 1937-1939 174 tons of ore were mined and the following metals recovered: 48 oz. gold, 996 oz. silver, 1931 lbs. lead, and 523 lbs. zinc.

Situated near the summit of the southern slope about 7 miles up Enterprise Creek valley, which is about 7 miles north of Slocan. Three adits spaced about 200 feet vertically apart and totalling about 400 feet have explored a quartz filled, fissure-vein lode cutting the Nelson granite porphyry - strike North-East and dip steeply South-East - small pockets of silver-bearing minerals associated with pyrite, sphalerite, and galena. Reported 2 tons of ore extracted from top adit.

in the Triple Lakes area of Christian Valley about 30 miles north of Rock Creek and seven miles due east of Beaverdell. There is ample water for drilling, mining, and milling, and the claims are crossed by good logging roads.

Trenching has exposed a shattered zone about 100 feet wide and numerous quartz stringers. On the Ivanhoe a 12 ft. quartz vein is reported to carry free gold. In 1938 six tons were shipped which yielded 4 oz. gold and 6 oz. silver.
