Dear Ted:

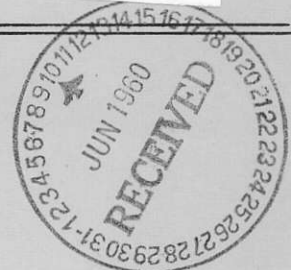
I'll check into this property as soon as I can but doubt if there is much that is attractive in the groups.



Dear Sir: Your letter April 30/60 is acknowledged with thanks. Enclosing a claim map, assay results to date and extracts from old Government reports on claims as indicated.

The claims have not been examined by engineers and reported on. Our work to date has comprised of road work to open up the claims preparatory to stripping. There are numerous old workings some of which are covered by Gov. rpt. enclosed.

The position of Camp McKinnay Gold Mine is indicated on the claim map and the ground is reported to fault to the South East.

JIM CROW. The Jim Crow mineral claim, owned by Hamilton, is situated on the same divide as the last mentioned property and about 3000 feet from Rock Creek. A fine grained basic igneous dyke is here exposed impregnated with fine particles of magnetic iron and a little copper. But as yet not in such quantity as to be of value. The property was located as a copper claim but occasionally shows gold values. A sample taken from the dyke gave on assay - Gold: trace Silver 1 oz. Copper 2.3%. A shaft has been started which was down some 10 feet and was partly timbered.

(Note: A grab sample to the S.W. some 30 feet was assayed last year
Gold .12 oz. Silver .15 oz. Copper 2.4%)

DAYTON. The Dayton mineral claim, owned by Younkin and Hamilton is situated on the divide between the main Rock Creek and the South Fork at an elevation of about 3900 feet and some 2800 feet from Rock Creek. On the surface there is exposed what appears to be an outcropping of a dyke, originally mineralized with iron sulphides but now largely oxidized. This oxidized material gives good colours of gold in the pan. To strike this surface showing at a depth, a shaft has been sunk 45 feet with a 10 foot cross-cut therefrom, but it failed to develop ore for the reason that the dyke was evidently faulted. The latter appears to have a strike about S.E. and is faulted S.W., the dip being uncertain but probably to the S.W. An open cut 60 x 80 ft. long, 8-12 ft. deep and 6 ft. wide exposed what appeared to be dyke matter much shattered and altered, showing bands of iron oxide running high in free gold. While in the bottom of the cut there was a band of from 24 to 36 inches wide of undetermined length, highly charged with iron sulphides and running high in gold. A sample from the bottom of the cut gave upon assay \$14.20 (1901 price) in gold and .5 oz. of silver. The development work done has certainly shown that the property has much promise but is not sufficient to prove anything more.

MINERAL DEPOSITS OF KETTLE RIVER Paper 37-21 1937 C.E. Cairnes

At the Dayton Camp considerable work, in the aggregate, was done years ago on the Jim Crow, Le Roi, War Eagle, and Dayton claims. Underground workings are now mostly inaccessible. Here sheer zones 3 to 4 feet wide, strike northwesterly across greenstone rocks near the northeast contact of a body of quartz diorite. The sheer zones carry very little vein quartz and the sheered greenstone and more massive wall-rocks are partly altered to ankeritic carbonate. The sulphides are mainly pyrite and some chalcopyrite. A shipment of about 40 tons from the Dayton in 1916 is reported to have carried 2 ozs. of gold and five ounces of silver to the ton and 5% copper.

Annual Report - 1935 Page D 9.

An oxidized stringer 4 inches wide in one of the open cuts assayed 4.70 ozs. per ton in gold. In past years some shipments were made from this stringer.

NIGHTHAWK. The Nighthawk mineral claim is owned by Messrs. Bash and Luce and is situated on the divide or ridge of land between the main Rock Creek and the South Fork of the same stream. The work done here is entirely superficial, of a prospecting character only, and consists of a number of large open cuts or trenches across the general trend of the mineral bearing formation. From what development had been done it would appear that there was a large dyke from 20 to 30 feet wide with a strike N.50W.(mag) dipping slightly to the east and with, apparently, a crushed zone of from a few inches to two feet in width lying between the dyke and diabasic country rocks. The dyke itself seems to be felsitic in character and is pretty generally mineralized throughout with yellow and white iron sulphides from which values of from \$6 to \$14 (1901 prices) were said to have been obtained, chiefly in gold with a little silver. Although the samples taken at the time as an average did not give nearly a high results. The first open cut was 40 x 10 x 15 feet, while the second was 50 x 5 and from 6 to 10 feet deep.
