Sirola Wear Sir - Would you be interested in examining Three groups of claims in the Vernon hining Division! 1st Group Selverado - 8 claims 12 miles up newportcreek from highway, west side of Okanagan lake. Road runs through elaims and is about 1500 feet from where work was done on claims. Considerable operant work on vein which is between 3 and 4 feetin width, it comes gold, silver, copper, lead and zenes The strike is down the hill towards the creek, by stripping The vernalong the strike considerable depth could be obtained for drufting on it.
