The Homestake Property has been investigated and reported on by Kilborn personnel. Based on the following assumptions it appears that an economically viable mining and processing operation can be undertaken at a production rate of 8400 tons ore per month. The assumptions include the following:

- (a) Purchase of the Dekalb Concentrator and associated mining equipment and ancillary facilities for \$1,600,000.
- (b) Production of a bulk sulfide concentrate which would be sold to Cominco based on the Cominco Open Contract for Lead Concentrates at the following metal prices in Canadian funds:
