The claim group lies 50 miles south west of Watson Lake, east of Letain Creek between Provencher Lake and Wolverine Creek (NTS 104 I-7). Andy mentions that lower grade chalcopyrite is disseminated widespread in the diorite alongside the showing. He mentions Katanga Mines of Vancouver had the property staked but apparently did not know they owned the showing since he has seen no assessment work on the area he examined. I advised him to visit Bill Sirola's office.
