The pozzalana at Prince George. I don't have any information about. MacIssac backed Jack Ryan when he secured a lease or series of leases on a pumice deposit 30 miles northwest of Pemberton on the PGE. Johnston National Storage officials put money in the deal. A survey of the lease locations was in progress last fall when some complications concerning the validity of the leases was discovered. The pumice has been known for a number of years and has been tested and found suitable for a light weight aggregate. Possibly Emil was talking about that, since pumice is classified in the building trades as a pozzulanic material.

Plan to run out the claim lines with Eric on the Tuya 1-4 cls when we move in to the Dease area. Lief, Eric's brother thinks there is a long narrow fraction in the Cassiar claims, which is covered by The Tuya claims. He was on the showing last month, says he is not impressed by it.
