
Dear Mr. Reynolds:

Thank you for your letter of September 8th regarding the Ample Mine.

The only information that we have been able to find on this property is contained in a 1932 B.C. Minister of Mines Report. The report mentions four parallel quartz veins varying in width from 14 inches to 8 feet and dipping at 20 to 25° into the hill. The assays from these veins averaged only \$1.75 per ton at the 1932 gold price and I am afraid this is hardly enough to justify investigation on our part. Unless you have some information to the contrary, then we cannot see any purpose in working on these veins.

It is always possible that more information has been developed since 1932 and we would be quite receptive to anything which might indicate that the picture is better than it appears to be in the old literature.

This is the Ample mine worked in 1897 but as the gold is with the Arsenic at that time they were unable to separate the Gold from same, they put in a 10 stamp mill and run through 755 tons of ore then quit because they could not recover the gold at least only the free gold, vein is 7 feet wide at the mouth of the tunnel and 32 feet at the end of same which is 170 feet long an incline tunnel the second tunnel is 253 feet long the copper is in the adjoining Argelites, the Chinese placer miners took out over 5,000,000 five million in placer gold below this property and I believe there is plenty left.

Geology - Altered sediments + interbedded volcanic rock formation.  
- 4 parallel quartz veins within 100' conforming with rock formation dipping 20°-25° into hill.  
Mineralization - Sparingly mineralized with iron sulphides in hard, cherty quartz.  
Vein widths - 14" to 8ft., average 54"  
Assays - 80¢ to 2.20, average 1.75/ton. - 1932 gold price
