From my past experience with this diminutive, neanderthall-type, I do not think it necessary to go to Port Hardy to examine this property.



Since mentioning this situation briefly to you over the phone this morning, Red Black has visited our office and submitted a $4^{11} \times 3^{11} \times 1^{11}$ hand specimen of solid chalcopyrite with associated magnetite. Evan Donaldson put him on to us.

Black said that he and Joe Nansen, an independent prospector, came upon this copper mineralization this summer. Black sent a specimen to a consulting engineer friend of Donaldson's in Toronto, who wrote advising them to stake it. They have staked 10 claims. The property is about 6 miles south of Port Hardy, and can be almost reached by a lumber road which can be used with permission from the lumber company. The main showing is about 500 feet off the lumber road. Nansen has obtained a dip-needle anomaly over the showing and for a 2000 foot length and 14 foot width. Black states that although there is not much rock exposed over the 2000 foot length, wherever one does find rock, it is about as well mineralized as the specimen he brought in.

I consider that this is something you should check on and visit. To arrange to do so you should contact Joe Nansen, c/o the Seagate Hotel in Port Mardy.

Black didn't know what deal they would want. Maybe Nansen will be able to give you some idea of the deal they want. In any event, let me know what you think of the property, and then if you like it we'll see what we can come up with in the way of a deal.
