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Summary

The traverse started at the headwaters of a tributary to the Yeth River. We sampled the East side of the river for soils every 300m both sides were sampled for tributary silts, approx halfway down the crk we tried to climb out of the gorge. Due to the steep nature of the cliff we had problems and R.L's pack fell down the slope and was lost. (see R.L's trav report for saved samples); We climbed East bank and followed the ridge down to Yeth River. For the first km rock was mainly serpentine then it changed to altered sediments and conglomerate. Large orange gossan down creek.
